

“two,” where it appears in the third line of said section, and inserting in lieu thereof the word, “three,” so that said section, when so amended, shall read as follows : Each member of the county board, shall be allowed and paid by the county, a compensation for his services and expenses in attending the meeting of the board, at the rate of three dollars per day, for the time he shall actually attend, and six cents for each mile traveled in going to and returning from the place of meeting; but no per diem allowance shall be made for any time occupied in traveling, where mileage is allowed therefor; and no supervisor shall be allowed to draw pay for more than fifteen days’ attendance on the county board in any one year, except for services as a member of a committee, as provided in section 668; provided, that in counties where the population exceeds fifteen thousand, the county board may sit and receive pay for not exceeding twenty days in each year.

Relating to compensation of county board.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 150.

AN ACT to prescribe certain duties of State Treasurer.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall hereafter be the duty of the state treasurer, between the tenth day of October and the succeeding first day of November of each and every year, to furnish to the county clerks of the several counties in this state, a full and complete statement of all moneys paid during the next preceding year, by said state treasurer, into the treasury of his (said clerk’s) respective county, which statement such clerk shall record at length, and file in his office.

Duties of state treasurer prescribed.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
