## CHAPTER 387.

AN ACT to appropriate a certain sum of money  
therein named to Adolph Glenz and James  
Strasilipka.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented  
in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to Adolph Glenz and James Strasilipka the sum of seventy-six dollars each, for services as messengers from the fourteenth day of January to the twentieth day of February, 1885, inclusive.

## CHAPTER 388.

AN ACT to divide the Eleventh ward of the city  
of Milwaukee.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented  
in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. All the territory now included in the Eleventh ward of the city of Milwaukee, which lies north of the center of Maple street, from First avenue to Eighth avenue, and which lies west from the center of Eighth avenue to

Eleventh ward  
divided.

Burnham street, and which lies north of the center of Burnham street from Eighth avenue to the city line, shall hereafter constitute and be the Eleventh ward of the city of Milwaukee; and all the territory now included in the Eleventh ward of said city, which lies south of the center of said Maple street, from First avenue to Eighth avenue, and which lies east from the center of Eighth avenue to Burnham street, and which lies south of the center of Burnham street from Eighth avenue to the city line shall hereafter constitute and be the Fourteenth ward of the city of Milwaukee; and said Eleventh and Fourteenth wards hereby created shall have all the rights and privileges, immunities and powers, and be subject to the same laws, regulations and ordinances as the other wards in said city.

Aldermen to be elected.

SECTION 2. At the next annual charter election in the city of Milwaukee there shall be elected in each of the said wards hereby created, one alderman, who shall hold his office for the term of one year, one alderman who shall hold his office for the term of two years, and one alderman who shall hold his office for the term of three years, and annually thereafter there shall be elected in each of said wards one alderman who shall hold his office for the term of three years; and it shall be the duty of the mayor to appoint the usual number of inspectors and clerks of election in each of the said wards, and to designate and provide suitable places for holding the elections therein.

Tenth district defined.

SECTION 3. The Eleventh, Twelfth and Fourteenth wards of the city of Milwaukee shall constitute the tenth district of the city of Milwaukee, of the districts into which said city was divided for the purposes of electing justices of the peace and constables.

Duty of comptroller.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of the city comptroller to apportion the amount of city indebtedness now charged to the Eleventh ward between the Eleventh and Fourteenth wards hereby created, in proportion to the respective equalized assessment rolls for the year 1886, and all real estate lying north of the center of Maple street from First avenue to Eighth avenue, and which lies west off from the center of Eighth avenue to Burnham street, and which lies north

of the center of Burnham street, from Eight avenue to the city line, and which, prior to the passage of this act, belonged to the Eleventh ward of said city, shall hereafter belong to the Eleventh ward hereby created. The city comptroller shall also apportion the ward fund of the Eleventh ward between the Eleventh and Fourteenth wards hereby created in the ratio of the equalized assessment rolls for the year A. D. 1886.

SECTION 5. It shall be the duty of the tax commissioner of the said city to appoint as by law and ordinances made and provided, an assessor for each of the said Eleventh and Fourteenth wards hereby created. Duty of tax commissioner.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the twenty-first day of March, A. D. 1886.

## CHAPTER 389.

**AN ACT** to regulate the appointment of inspectors of election and the registration of electors in cities of over twenty thousand inhabitants.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows :*

SECTION 1. The mayor of every incorporated city in this state, which, by the census of 1880, contained a population in excess of twenty thousand, shall present to the board of aldermen of such city at its first regular meeting in September of each year, the names of three persons for inspectors of elections and the names of two persons for clerks of elections, for each election precinct in said city. Such inspectors shall be electors in the precinct for which they shall be appointed inspectors; shall be able to read and write the English language understandingly; shall not be candidates to be voted for at any election for which they may be appointed inspectors; and not more than two of such inspectors shall belong to
