CHAPTER 454.

AN ACT limiting the amount of damage which may be recovered from counties, towns, cities or villages for injuries received by reason of defective highways and sidewalks.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. In any action brought against any county, town, city or village under the provisions of section 1339, of chapter 52, of the revised statutes, the amount recovered by any person for such damage or injury shall in no case exceed the sum of five thousand dollars.

Extent of damages that may be recovered.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication. Approved April 11, 1885.

CHAPTER 455.

AN ACT in relation to the fishing industries of Lake Michigan, Lake Superior and Green Bay, and to protect and increase the fish supply thereof, and to appropriate a certain sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. It shall be unlawful after the passage of this act, for any person for himself or for others, to set in the waters of Lake Michigan, Lake Superior or Green Bay, being within the boundaries of this state or any of the bays thereof, any pound, gill, trap, fyke, or float net, or any other fishing net whose mesh is less than three and one-half inches, stretch measure, or one and three-quarters inches bar, except as herein-after provided; provided, however, that after the year 1885, pound nets, having a smaller mesh than above stated, may be used only when the
