CHAPTER 60.

AN ACT to amend section 2265, of the revised statutes of 1878, relating to the vacation of plats.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Relating to the vacation of plats.

Section 1. Section 2265, of the revised statutes, is hereby amended so as to read as follows: Section 2265. The circuit courts may, upon the application or petition of a majority of the proprietors of any duly recorded plat of lands, or any part thereof, or lot therein, whether such plat shall have been heretofore designated as a city or village plat, or addition thereto, or otherwise, alter or vacate such plat, or any part thereof, or any street, public walk or alley therein. Such application or petition shall be made to the circuit court of the district in which said plat or part thereof is situated; notice of such application shall be given by serving a copy on all interested parties, not signing the petition or application and by posting a notice thereof, in at least two of the most public places in the county, and by publishing a copy of the same in a newspaper printed or circulated in said county, once in each week, at least eight weeks prior to the sitting of the court to which the application or petition is intended to be made; and by the service of such notice in the manner required for the service of a summons in the circuit court, on the officers of the town, city or village in which such plat or part thereof is situated, at least two weeks previous to the time fixed for the hearing of such application or petition.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
