

near them. All belting, shafting, gearing, hoists, fly-wheels, elevators and drums of manufacturing establishments so located as to be dangerous to employes when engaged in their ordinary duties shall be securely guarded or fenced so as to be safe to persons employed in any such place of employment.

Penalty for failure to comply.

SECTION 3. Any person, company or corporation who shall refuse or fail to comply with the provisions of this act, shall forfeit not to exceed twenty-five dollars for each offense, and every day's failure after the first conviction shall constitute a separate offense, after due notice by the state factory inspector.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 550.

AN ACT to amend chapter 184, of laws 1881, entitled, "an act to provide for the laying out of a state road from Ahnapee, Kewaunee county," to intersect the Green Bay and Sturgeon Bay state road in the town of Nassewaupee, Door county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

G. G. Berge, et al., appointed commissioners to lay out state road.

SECTION 1. G. G. Berge, of Clay Banks, John Keogh, of Forestville, Door county, and August Harmann, of the town of Ahnapee, Kewaunee county, are hereby appointed commissioners to lay out and establish a state road, commencing at a point in the town of Ahnapee, Kewaunee county, where the section line between sections twenty-three and twenty-four strikes the lake shore road between the city of Ahnapee and the city of Sturgeon Bay; thence north on the section line between sections twenty-three and twenty-four, thirteen and fourteen, and eleven and twelve, to the north

line of said sections eleven and twelve; thence east one mile between section one and section twelve to the town line between township twenty-five, range twenty-five, and township twenty-five, range twenty-six; thence north on the town line between town twenty-five, range twenty-five, and town twenty-five, range twenty-six, in Kewaunee county; thence north on the town line between town twenty-six, range twenty-five, and town twenty-six, range twenty-six, town twenty-seven, range twenty-five, and town twenty-seven, range twenty-six, until the same intersects with the Green Bay and Sturgeon Bay state road in Door county.

SECTION 2. Two of said commissioners shall constitute a quorum for the transaction of business and shall be entitled to such compensation for laying out said road as the board of supervisors of the respective counties through which such road may pass shall deem sufficient; provided, that no compensation shall be allowed for laying out said road, on any road that may have been heretofore established; and further provided that said road shall be laid out in accordance with the state laws in relation to state roads.

Quorum—compensation.

SECTION 3. For the purpose of defraying the expenses of improving and to make said state road in good condition for general travel a tax of two mills on a dollar on the assessed valuation of the taxable property in the towns of Forestville and Clay Banks, in the county of Door, shall be levied for the three years commencing in the year 1887, to be collected as other taxes, and to be placed in a separate column on the respective assessment rolls, which money when so collected shall be paid upon the order of said commissioners by the town treasurer, and shall be expended by said commissioners for the sole purpose of improving said state road in places along said road which shall be found unimproved and not in a condition for travel for teams and vehicles. The money collected as aforesaid in each of the towns aforesaid shall be expended exclusively by the commissioners for the improvement of said state road in the town from which collected and which said road passes through. Such tax shall cease to be collected when that portion of said state road

lying between the towns of Forestville and Clay Banks, in said county of Door, shall be completed.

Report to be made by commissioners.

SECTION 4. It shall be the duty of said commissioners each year at the annual town meeting to report to the respective towns of the progress made in such improvements during the past year, and of the amount expended by them in the respective towns.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 551.

AN ACT to amend section 2039, of the revised statutes of 1878, in relation to the alienation of real estate.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Amending section 2039, R. S.—alienation of real estate.

SECTION 1. Section 2039, of the revised statutes is hereby amended by inserting in the fourth line of said section between the words, "estate" and "except," the words, "and twenty-one years thereafter," so that said section when so amended shall read as follows: The absolute power of alienation shall not be suspended by any limitation or condition whatever for a longer period than during the continuance of two lives in being at the creation of the estate and twenty-one years thereafter, except when real estate is given, granted or devised to literary or charitable corporations which shall have been organized under the laws of this state for their sole use and benefit, and except also in the single case mentioned in the next section.
