CHAPTER 235.

AN ACT to authorize C. M. Upham, Mathias Miller and F. D. Naber, their heirs or assigns, to construct and maintain a dam or dams across the Wolf river, in Shawano county, state of Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Authorizing C. M. Upham et al to build dam across Wolf River, Shawano county.

SECTION 1. C. M. Upham, Mathias Miller and F. D. Naber, their heirs or assigns, are hereby authorized to construct and maintain a dam across the Wolf river, in Shawano county, Wisconsin, for manufacturing and other purposes, and to erect and maintain such piers and booms in connection therewith as may be necessary or convenient for holding, storing, assorting, driving and handling logs to be manufactured at Shawano. Said dam shall be constructed and maintained on either of sections twenty-five or thirty-six, in township twenty-seven, range fifteen east. Logs destined for points below on said river shall not be detained longer than may be necessary to separate from the general drives of logs such as may be intended for manufacturing at the city of Shawano, or at or near said dam; provided, that said dam shall not exceed fourteen feet in height and shall be so constructed as not to obstruct or impede the running of logs, timber or lumber down said river; provided, further, that a suitable slide sufficient in width shall be maintained at the expense of the owners of said dam, with guide booms and permanent piers so as to pass all logs, timber and lumber down and over said slide without delay, hindrance or waste.

How constructed.

May exercise rights conferred by sec. 1777, revised statutes.

SECTION 2. The said parties aforesaid, their associates, heirs and assigns, for the purpose of acquiring any flowage rights that they may deem necessary in carrying out the provisions of this act, may exercise all powers granted to corporations by section 1777, of the revised statutes of Wisconsin, as amended by chapter 318, of the laws of 1882.

SECTION 3. The right to repeal or amend this act is hereby reserved. Rights reserved.

SECTION 4. Chapter 213, of the laws of Wisconsin for 1879, is hereby repealed. Repeal chapter 213, laws 1879.

SECTION 5. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after the passage and publication.

CHAPTER 236.

AN ACT to authorize George S. Biron and Laura Biron, their heirs and assigns, to raise, build and maintain a certain dam across the Wisconsin river, in Wood county, Wisconsin.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. George S. Biron and Laura Biron, their associates, heirs and assigns, are hereby authorized and empowered to raise, build and maintain a dam across the Wisconsin river, not more than eight feet in height above low water mark, on section thirty-four in township twenty-three north, of range six east, for hydraulic manufacturing, booming and flooding purposes; and also to erect and maintain mills, machinery, booms and piers, and other suitable structures and appendages to enable them to use the waters of said river raised by said dam for the purposes aforesaid; provided, that said dam shall be so constructed as not to impede the running of lumber, logs and timber down said river, and shall be provided with a suitable slide therein, at least two feet below the general height of said dam. And for the purpose of erecting and maintaining such dam and utilizing the water power created thereby and acquiring any flowage rights that they may deem necessary, not now held by them, the said George S. Biron and Laura Biron, their heirs, associates and assigns, may exercise all powers granted to corporations by section 1777, of the revised
