CHAPTER 372.

AN ACT to authorize Henry J. Rogers and Aug. L. Smith, to build and maintain a dam across Fox river, in Outagamie county.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Henry J. Rogers and Aug. L. Smith, and their successors and assigns are hereby authorized to build and maintain a dam across Fox river from lots six and seven, in section twenty-four, south of the river, to lots two and three, in section twenty-two, north of the river, in township twenty-one north, of range eighteen east of fourth principal meridian, and to make use of the hydraulic power furnished by said dam.

Authorizing Henry J. Rogers et al to build dam across Fox river, Outagamie county.

SECTION 2. Said dam shall not exceed in height twenty-eight feet nor raise a head to exceed twenty-two feet.

Height.

SECTION 3. Said dam shall have a spill including needle dam or sluiceway of not less than seven hundred feet in length, and shall have a sluiceway or needle dam in same to discharge water in time of freshets of length of two hundred and fifty feet at least, and depth of five feet at least below the line of the main spill thereof.

To have spill and sluiceway.

SECTION 4. Chapter 146, of the revised statutes of 1878, commonly called the "mill dam law," shall be, and is hereby declared to be applicable to any dam which may be maintained by virtue of this act.

Ch. 146 R. S. to apply.

SECTION 5. The power to alter or repeal this act is hereby reserved.

Right reserved.

SECTION 6. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
