## CHAPTER 250.

AN ACT to amend section 5, of chapter 339, laws of 1889, entitled "An act to provide for the relief of indigent and needy Union soldiers," etc.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 5, of chapter 339, of the laws of 1889, is hereby amended by adding to the end of said section the following: Provided, further, that in all counties where the tax levied in pursuance of section 1, of this act, shall exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars, the county board of supervisors shall fix a salary to be paid to the secretary of the soldiers' relief commission not exceeding the sum of five hundred dollars per annum, to be paid quarterly out of the county treasury of said county, and such salary so fixed shall be in full for all services rendered by said secretary and in lieu of all fees, except disbursements for stationery and postage, so that said section, when so amended, shall read as follows: Section 5. The county board of supervisors shall allow the persons composing the commission the same compensation allowed members of the county board, for regular meetings of said commission, and their actual expenses incurred in the performance of their other duties, as defined in this act, on presentation of an itemized statement of the same; provided, however, that there shall not be to exceed four such meetings in any one year. Provided, further, that in all counties where the tax levied in pursuance of section 1, of this act, shall exceed the sum of ten thousand dollars, the county board of supervisors shall fix a salary to be paid to the secretary of the soldiers' relief commission not exceeding the sum of five hundred dollars per annum, to be paid quarterly out of the county treasury of said county, and such salary so fixed shall be in full for all services rendered by said secretary, and in lieu of all fees except disbursements for stationery and postage.

County board shall fix compensation of commissioners, also secretary.

**SECTION 2.** All acts and parts of acts conflicting with the provisions of this act are hereby repealed.

## CHAPTER 251.

**AN ACT** to provide fishways in dams and other obstructions on the Brule river in Douglas county.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

Fishways to be maintained in dams.

**SECTION 1.** It shall be the duty of all persons, owning, managing, occupying or having in charge any dam, boom, pier or other obstruction of any kind whatsoever, now erected or hereafter to be erected, in, on, or across the stream in Douglas county, Wisconsin, known as the Brule river, to construct and maintain in or upon such dam, boom, pier or other obstruction, a good and sufficient fishway, which will permit the certain and easy passage of fish up and down said river, and upon plans which shall be approved by the board of fish commissioners of the state of Wisconsin. And it shall be the duty of all such persons owning, managing, occupying or having in charge any such dam, boom, pier or other obstruction in or on said river, as aforesaid, to keep such fishways in good repair, and open for the easy and free passage of fish up and down said river, from the fifteenth day of June until the first day of October next ensuing in each and every year.

State fish commissioners to furnish plans.

**SECTION 2.** It shall be the duty of the state board of commissioners of fisheries to furnish any person applying for the same a plan for a fishway in any dam, boom, pier or other obstruction being now in or across said river, or which
