CHAPTER 318.

AN ACT providing for the taking of testimony on inquests of the dead, and the payment of fees for the same.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Any justice of the peace or coroner, authorized by law to take and hold inquests of the dead, may, whenever he deems it necessary and proper, employ a competent stenographer to take and transcribe the testimony of all witnesses examined at any inquest held by him.

Justice of peace may employ stenographer when holding inquests of the death.

SECTION 2. Such stenographer shall receive for his services at the rate of ten cents per folio for all testimony taken and transcribed by him, to be audited by the county board and paid out of the county treasury of the proper county.

Pay ten cents per folio.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
