

interstate commerce; provided, that this section shall be intended to include among those required to obtain licenses as peddlers, all such persons as are transient merchants, traders or dealers; such persons as bring into any town, city or village in any manner, goods, wares, merchandise, notions, or other articles of trade, except such as are excepted in this section, for the purpose of selling the same in the manner provided in this section, and who do not intend to become and do not become permanent merchants, traders or dealers in such town, city or village; permanent merchants, traders and dealers being here defined to be those who remain in a locality engaged in trade for a period of six months or more; or who pay taxes upon their goods, wares, merchandise or other articles of trade the same as other resident dealers.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 85.

AN ACT to appropriate to the commissioners of fisheries a sum of money therein named.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Appropriation
of \$10,000 for
fish hatchery
at Bayfield.

SECTION 1. There is hereby appropriated to the commissioners of fisheries of the state of Wisconsin, out of any moneys in the state treasury not otherwise appropriated, the sum of

ten thousand dollars, which sum shall be in addition to the amounts now annually appropriated and shall be used in completing the improvements at the state hatchery near Bayfield, including the erection of permanent buildings and equipment thereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 86.

AN ACT to promote physical education.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Physical education may form a part of the regular school curriculum in all normal, high and city schools, entirely or partly maintained by the state.

Physical education may form a part of school curriculum.

SECTION 2. In all normal schools and normal departments of high schools, the instruction of the pupils may be such as to enable them to become competent teachers of physical education in common or graded public schools.

Instruction may be such as to enable pupils to become competent teachers.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
