## CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT to enable church insurance companies to amend their articles of organization.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Amendments to articles, how made. C'opy of amendments to be filed with insurance commissioner.

Section 1. Any corporation organized under chapter 268, laws of 1891, or under chapter 89 of the statutes of 1898 as a church insurance corporation, may at any meeting of its members by a vote of at least one-half of the total number of votes to which the members thereof shall be entitled, unless a greater vote shall be required by its articles, amend its articles of organization, so as to modify its business or purposes within the purview of said chapter, change its name or location, change its officers, number of directors, or the tenure of their offices in such manner as to effect rotation in office, or provide anything which might have been originally provided in such articles. Such amendment shall be adopted only in accordance with the articles of organization if a mode of amending the same shall have been therein prescribed. adopted, a copy of such amendment with a certificate thereto affixed, signed by the president and secretary and sealed with the corporate seal, if there be any, stating the fact and date of the adoption of such amendment and that such copy is a true copy of the original shall be filed with the commissioner of insurance, and the commissioner shall issue his certificate that such articles are the amended articles of such corporation.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force, from and after its passage and publication.
