CHAPTER 149.

AN ACT to compel persons to testify in prosecutions brought under sections 4352 and 4583 of the statutes of 1898; and to grant immunity to such persons so compelled to testify.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Witnesses compelled to testify; immunity to such witnesses.

SECTION 1. No person shall be excused or privileged from testifying fully under oath in any prosecution brought under the provisions of sections 4352 or 4583 of the statutes of 1898 or for any of the causes mentioned in either of said sections when so ordered to testify by a court of record or any judge thereof; but no person shall be prosecuted or subjected to any penalty or forfeiture for or on account of any transaction, matter or thing concerning which such person may so testify or produce evidence, except for perjury committed in giving such testimony.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
