

venient to the removal of such mineral from such lands and to the proper exercise of such mineral rights, and shall be further subject to the continuing easement in the state and its assigns to enter and occupy such lands in any manner necessary and convenient to the development, maintenance and use of any such water rights.

Nothing contained in this section shall be construed to provide for the continued ownership in the state of any stone used for building purposes nor of any sand or gravel.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 375.

AN ACT to amend sections 1492aa and 1492e, and to create a new subsection to section 1492b of the statutes, relating to the live stock sanitary board, and making an appropriation therefor.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Sections 1492aa and 1492e of the statutes are amended to read: Section 1492aa. 1. There is hereby constituted a state live stock sanitary board which shall consist of three members of the state board of agriculture, to be chosen by that body from its membership, the bacteriologist of the state agricultural college, and the state veterinarian; the last two mentioned members to be ex-officio members of the board, and the state veterinarian to serve without additional compensation. The members selected from the state board of agriculture shall hold office for a term of three years, except that the member first chosen shall hold his position for one year, the second for two years, and the third for three years from the first day of June, 1901.

2. They shall serve without salary, but shall be paid three dollars per day, and all members of the board shall be paid their actual expenses when in the discharge of their duties.

3. Meetings of the board shall be limited to twelve in each year, and the service of no member on said board, for which a per diem is paid, shall exceed \* \* \* sixty days in any one year. The board may organize by the election of a president

and secretary and shall hold its office in such room in the capitol as the governor may designate.

Section 1492e. 1. The state live stock sanitary board shall be allowed for \* \* \* *clerical assistance and other purposes* a sum not to exceed \* \* \* *two thousand dollars annually.*  
\* \* \*

2. The state veterinarian is hereby authorized to *appoint an assistant state veterinarian, who shall be a duly qualified veterinary surgeon, at a salary not to exceed fifteen hundred dollars per year and his actual expenses incurred in the performance of his duties; and the state veterinarian may call to his assistance, as may be necessary in the performance of his work, duly qualified veterinary surgeons, who shall be paid for their services at the rate of \* \* \* five dollars per day and their actual expenses for the time they are actually employed as assistants. \* \* \* All accounts shall be audited upon itemized vouchers, certified to by the state veterinarian \* \* \*, but no person shall be considered a veterinary surgeon within the meaning of this act, who is not a regular graduate in good standing of some recognized veterinary college in the United States, Canada or Europe.*

3. The appraisers herein provided for, shall receive two dollars for each day actually employed as such, which amount shall be paid out of the county treasury, upon the certificate of the justice by whom they were summoned.

4. The justice of the peace and other officers who may perform any duty hereunder shall have the same fees as are allowed by law in criminal proceedings in justice courts, and shall be paid by the county in which their services are performed.

5. The superintendent of public property is hereby instructed to furnish the state live stock sanitary board with the necessary stationery and postage stamps for its work.

SECTION 2. There is added to section 1492b of the statute a new subsection to read: 8. *In order to determine the competency of parties other than licensed veterinarians, who may wish to apply the tuberculin test to cattle, the live stock sanitary board is hereby authorized to hold examinations of such parties, and to issue permits to make such tests to those passing the examination, which permit shall entitle the holder to legal recognition in his work, unless, for cause, it be revoked by the board. Providing that such examinations, relative to determining the competency of persons desiring to apply the tuberculin test, shall not be formulated so as to authorize only veterinary surgeons and graduates of the state agricultural college to conduct such tests.*

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 376.

AN ACT relating to further provisions for the interstate park of the Dalles of the St. Croix and appropriating money therefor and for the purchase of the toll-bridge from said park to Taylor's Falls, Minnesota.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The commission provided by chapter 395 of the laws of 1905 is hereby continued with all the power therein conferred, and for the purposes therein expressed. In addition thereto the commission may purchase the existing toll-bridge over the St. Croix river from the said park to Taylor's Falls, Minnesota, subject to the following conditions: That whenever by negotiation with the authorities of Minnesota and the authorities and parties residing at St. Croix Falls, provisions can be made for the purchase of such toll-bridge, one-fourth of the amount of the purchase price, not exceeding the sum of \$1,750, shall be paid out of the state treasury.

SECTION 2. In case it shall be determined not to purchase such bridge, the said park commission may cause to be constructed at some point to be determined upon either above or below the existing bridge a new free bridge adequate and sufficient for all purposes, on condition that the proper authorities within the state of Minnesota co-operate in the construction of said bridge and make provision for the payment of one-half of the expense thereof, and that one-fourth thereof be provided for by the towns, villages and counties in Wisconsin adjoining said park or by the citizens thereof, and one-fourth the amount for the expense of building such bridge, not exceeding the sum of \$2,750 shall be paid out of the state treasury.

SECTION 3. All the acts of the commission in making contract and carrying out the purposes of this act shall first be approved by the governor and in addition to the foregoing amount specified a sum not exceeding \$500,00 annually is appropriated for the expense of maintaining and enlarging said park. A sufficient sum of money to carry out the purposes of this act is hereby appropriated.
