CHAPTER 124.

AN ACT to amend subdivision b, of subsection 1, of section 4562d, of the statutes, relating to the closed season for the hunting of deer in Door county.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision b, of subsection 1, of section 4562d, of the statutes, is amended to read: (Section 4562d) 1. (b) Any deer in the counties of Grant, La Fayette, Green, Rock, Walworth, Kenosha, Racine, Milwaukee, Waukesha, Jefferson, Dane, Iowa, Crawford, Richland, Sauk, Columbia, Dodge, Buffalo, Washington, Ozaukee, Sheboygan, Fond du Lac, Green Lake, Pepin, Marquette, Adams, Vernon, Monroe, La Crosse, Waushara, Winnebago, Calumet, Manitowoc, Outagamie, Brown, Kewaunee, Portage and Waupaca at any time, nor in the * * * county of Door * * * until November first, * * * 1915.

SECTION 2. All acts or parts of acts conflicting with any of the provision of this act are repealed in so far as they are inconsistent therewith.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 125.

AN ACT to create section 4595m of the statutes, relating to work on Sunday newspapers.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 4595m. 1. In any action to recover compensation for newspaper advertising, it shall be no defense that such advertising was published or printed in a newspaper, dated, printed or issued on the first day of the week.

2. In any action to recover compensation for labor performed on any newspaper dated, published or issued on the first day of the week, it shall be no defense that such labor was performed on the first day of the week.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.
