CHAPTER 107.

AN ACT to create section 486—1 of the statutes, relating to exchanges of school library books among school districts.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is added to the statutes a new section to read: Section 486—1. 1. School library books belonging to one school district may be loaned by the school board of the district to the school board of another school district for use in the school library of that district in consideration of school library books similarly loaned in exchange therefor.

2. County or district superintendents may arrange such exchanges and loans of school library books among the school districts in their jurisdiction as may be mutually agreed upon by the school boards of the districts concerned.

3. A school district receiving books from another district under the provisions of this act shall be responsible for all losses sustained on account of books lost or damaged beyond ordinary wear and tear.

4. All books loaned or exchanged under the provisions of this act shall be returned to the school library from which they have been obtained not later than two weeks before the close of the annual school term of the district from which the books have been received.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect and be in force from and after its passage and publication.

CHAPTER 108.

AN ACT to amend subsection 1 of section 4560a—2 of the statutes, relating to the use of seines and nets in inland waters.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection 1 of section 4560a—2 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 4560a—2) 1. The state fish and game warden may upon application by any resident or nonresident of the state of Wisconsin, issue a license to use and operate a seine, fyke, hoop net or turtle net in any of the inland waters of the state of Wisconsin, except Rice Lake, French lake, Mud lake, Round lake, French slough, Spring creek, Spring slough, and Black river in La Crosse county; Courtois pond and French-
