AN ACT to amend subdivision (c) of subsection 3 of section 1927 of the statutes, relating to town mutual insurance companies.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subdivision (c) of subsection 3 of section 1927 of the statutes is amended to read: (Section 1927. 3.) (c) The articles of organization may be amended without notice by a resolution adopted by \* \* \* *two-thirds* of the votes cast on the question at any annual \* \* \* meeting. Such articles may also be amended by a resolution adopted by two-thirds of the votes cast on the question of a special meeting; provided, at least thirty days' notice thereof, reciting the proposed amendment shall be given by mail to the members. The secretary shall give such notice upon written request therefor by ten or more members. Within ten days after the adoption of such amendment two copies thereof with the affidavit of the president and secretary showing compliance with the law, shall be forwarded to the commissioner of insurance, and if approved by him and by the attorney-general, the former shall file one copy in his office and attach to the other copy his certificate of such filing. Such certified copy shall be recorded as provided for the articles of organization and a like certificate made by the register of deeds. Dissolution of a company may be effected by an amendment of the articles in like manner.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
