**CHAPTER 352.**

AN ACT changing the name of the village of Welcome, Outagamie county, Wisconsin, to the name of Bear Creek.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The name of the village of Welcome, Outagamie county, Wisconsin, as at present organized and constituted is changed to Bear Creek and such village shall hereafter be called and known in law, and otherwise, in all places whatsoever, and for all purposes, as the village of Bear Creek.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

**CHAPTER 353.**

AN ACT to amend section 573aa of the statutes, relating to the reception and treatment of crippled or deformed children at the state public school at Sparta.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 573aa of the statutes is amended to read: Section 573aa. 1. In addition to the classes of children now received at the state public school for neglected or dependent children at Sparta, pursuant to existing laws, there shall also be received as pupils in the said school, any \* \* \* children under fourteen years of age, residents of this state, \* \* \* who are crippled or deformed in body, or who are suffering from disease through which they are likely to become crippled or deformed, provided their bodily ailments or diseases are \* \* \* curable by surgical operation or hospital treatment at the school with \* \* \* facilities, \* \* \* appliances, material, equipment and professional skill and assistants provided therefor, subject only to the limitations contained in the next section.

2. The board of control shall engage and fix the salaries of additional physicians, surgeons, nurses, teachers and other employes necessary to carry out the provisions of this section, and shall equip such school with the necessary appliances, material, equipment and facilities therefor.

3. *The expense of treating, educating and maintaining any child in said school under the provisions of this section shall be borne by the parent, parents or guardian of such child, if not indigent, and the amount thereof shall be determined by the board, but no child shall be denied admission to such school under the provisions of this section for the reason that such child or its parents or guardian are unable to pay for treatment, education and maintenance therein.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 354.

AN ACT to repeal section 1379—31s of the statutes and to create a new section to be numbered 1379—31s of the statutes, relating to commissioners of drainage.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1379—31s of the statutes is repealed.

SECTION 2. There is added to the statutes a new section to be numbered and to read: Section 1379—31s. Commissioners of drainage districts may be examined in accordance with the rules and provisions of section 4068 of the statutes.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 355.

AN ACT to amend section 1762 of the statutes, relating to corporations.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Section 1762 of the statutes is amended to read: Section 1762. When not otherwise specially provided by law or by the by-laws of any corporation the directors or trustees thereof shall call and order the elections of the officers of such corporation annually; and if they refuse so to do or if from any other cause it shall happen that an election of directors or trustees shall not take place at the annual meeting such corpor-
