CHAPTER 420.

AN ACT to amend subsections (4), (5), (9), and (13) of section 40.09 and repealing subsection (23) of section 40.09 of the statutes, relating to the powers of the school district meeting.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsections (4), (5), (9), and (13) of section 40.09 are amended to read: (40.09) (4) To designate a site for a district schoolhouse or teacherage.

(5) To vote such tax as the meeting shall deem sufficient to purchase or lease a suitable site for a schoolhouse or teacherage, to build, hire or purchase a schoolhouse or teacherage and to keep in repair and furnish the same with the necessary fuel and appendages.

(9) To vote a tax * * * for the purchase of maps, blackboards, and school apparatus.

(13) To authorize the district board to purchase textbooks for use in the public schools, to be loaned or furnished free to pupils under such conditions as * * * may be prescribed by the electors or required by the statutes and to levy a tax sufficient to defray the expense thereof.

SECTION 2. Subsection (23) section 40.09 of the statutes is hereby repealed.

SECTION 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 421.

AN ACT to create section 36.225, and paragraph (o) of subsection (3) of section 20.41 of the statutes, providing for the establishment of a branch experimental station in Door county for carrying on horticultural and agricultural investigations, and making an appropriation.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes and a new paragraph is added to subsection (3) of section 20.41 of the statutes to read: 36.225 (1) The regents of the university are authorized to establish a branch experimental station in Door county for the purpose of carrying on horticultural and agricultural investigations and demonstrations on problems that are

designed to aid in the development of the fruit and farm interests of that portion of the state.

(2) The state conservation commission is authorized to enter into mutual agreement with the regents of the university for the use of the necessary farm equipment and such necessary land within the Peninsular State Park in said county as may be available for such experimental work.

(20.41) (3) (o) For the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1919, five thousand dollars, provided that the county board of Door county appropriate a similar amount on or before July 1, 1919; for the fiscal year beginning July 1, 1920, twelve thousand dollars, to carry out the provisions of section 36.225.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 422.

AN ACT to amend subsection (1) of section 20.62 of the statutes, relating to salaries of justices of the supreme court.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 20.62 is amended to read: (20.62) (1) To each justice of said court whose term of office commenced prior to the 1st day of July, * * * 1919, an annual salary of * * * *seven thousand five hundred* dollars; and to each justice whose term of office commenced thereafter, an annual salary of * * * *eight thousand five hundred* dollars. *The justice serving as chief justice, as provided by law, shall receive an additional salary of five hundred dollars per annum, during the period of such service.*

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
