The following general orders of the industrial commission shall be appended to and made part of the same compilation: General orders on safety; general orders on sanitation; general orders on safety and sanitation in laundries; general orders on existing buildings; elevator code; building code; general orders on safety in building construction; electrical safety code; industrial lighting code; general orders on fire prevention; boiler code; refrigerator plant code; general orders on zinc mines; rules for the regulation of private employment agencies; general orders under women's hours of labor law—orders 1-5, inclusive. Said compilation and codification may also include such other sections of the statutes, and general orders of the industrial commission, and laws of this state relative to labor as the said commission may deem advisable. The industrial commission shall prepare printer's copy thereof and shall deliver the same to the printing board and the said board shall immediately deliver said printer's copy to the state printer, together with a proper order for the printing of five thousand copies thereof in pamphlet form with paper cover.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 427.

AN ACT to create section 40.575 of the statutes, relating to the granting of diplomas of graduation from high schools.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 40.575 Any student of a high school in this state who, during the year at the end of which he would have graduated, entered any branch of the military or naval service of the United States during the war with Germany and her allies shall be granted a diploma of graduation from such high school. Such diploma shall have all the attributes of diplomas regularly granted to graduates of such high school.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
