taining, and no moneys, except from the receipts therefrom, shall ever be used therefor; and provided further that in case said publication or magazine shall not be so self-sustaining, or shall cease so to be, the same shall thereupon cease to be issued.

SECTION 2. There is added to section 20.20 of the statutes a new subsection to be numbered and to read: (20.20) (12) All moneys received by the conservation commission from the sale of subscriptions to any publication or magazine, as provided in subsection (7) of section 29.21, shall be paid, within one week after receipt, into the general fund, and are appropriated therefrom, for the purpose of carrying out said subsection.

Section 3. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 609.

AN ACT to amend subsection (5) of section 20.49, relating to highway maps and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. Subsection (5) of section 20.49 is amended to read: (20.49) (5) On July 1, 1917, three thousand dollars, to be used as a revolving appropriation, for the making and publishing of a map of the state of Wisconsin showing thereon the trunk highway system, as provided by subsection 14 of section 1313; all moneys received by each and every person for or on behalf of the superintendent of public property from the sale of such maps, shall be paid within one week after receipt into the general fund, and are appropriated therefrom and added to this appropriation.

On July 1, 1919, not to exceed twenty-five thousand dollars for carrying out the purposes of subsection (13a) of section 35.84 of the statutes.

Section 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
