solids, added milk fat, a natural flavoring, edible gelatin or harmless gum, harmless color, and shall contain not less than twelve per cent of milk fat and five egg yolks or their equivalent in egg powder or egg yolk powder in each gallon, nor more than one-half of one per cent of said gelatin or gum, or a mixture of said gelatin or gum. The volume of custard ice cream (New York ice cream) after being melted shall be not less than one-half the volume of the custard ice cream (New York ice cream).

CHAPTER 117.

AN ACT to amend section 130.01 of the statutes, relating to auctions.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 130.01 of the statutes is amended to read : There shall be paid by the auctioneer to the town treas-130.01 urer, for the use of the town, upon all sales by auction made in any town and outside of a city or village of goods, wares and merchandise, except household furniture which has been used as such, twenty per centum out of the gross receipts accruing from such sales, except when sale is made by virtue of a chattel mortgage, or of a rule, order or judgment of a court, or of some law of the state or the United States respecting the collection of some tax or duty; or in consequence of a general assignment of property or effects for the benefit of creditors; or when made of property belonging to the state or of the United States; or when made by or on behalf of any executor or administrator; or when made of his farm property by or on behalf of a resident farmer who has paid the taxes lawfully levied on his property; or when made for the purpose of closing up his business by or on behalf of any merchant who shall reside and trade in any town, city or village and who shall have paid the taxes lawfully levied on his stock in provided, that in the trade: * last case ŧ such sale shall be made in the town, city or village in

which such taxes were paid. Whenever the auctioneer or the owner of the property sold or any person employed by them or either of them shall buy anything at any such sale the same duty shall be paid as if any other person were purchaser thereof, and sales on credit shall be liable to duty as if made for eash. Sales at auction or to the highest bidder, within the meaning of this chapter, shall include all sales by auction whether the property is put up to the highest bidder in fact or whether it is sold by what is usually called "dutch auction," or by bidding down the seller thereof, or by adding to the quantity of property first offered for sale at a fixed price, or in any other way if made to evade the provisions hereof.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

CHAPTER 118.

AN ACT to amend section 49.10 of the statutes, making the property of indigent persons chargeable for public aid received by them.

The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Section 49.10 of the statutes is amended to read: 49.10 If any person *** *** *at the time of receiving* any relief, support, or maintenance at public charge, under this chapter or as an inmate of any state or municipal institution, or at any time thereafter, is *** * *** the owner of property, the authorities charged with the care of the poor of the municipality, or the board in charge of the institution, chargeable with such relief, support, or maintenance may sue for and collect the value of the same against such person and against his estate. In any such action or proceeding the statutes of limitation shall not be pleaded in defense; but the court may, in its discretion, refuse to render judgment or allow the claim in favor of the claimant in any case where a parent, wife, or child is dependent on such property for future support.
