**CHAPTER 277.**

AN ACT making an appropriation to Dane county to reimburse the county for a balance due by reason of inheritance taxes erroneously paid to the state.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to Dane county the sum of one thousand four hundred three dollars and twenty-three cents, together with interest thereon at the rate of six per cent per annum from November 22, 1924, until paid.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

**CHAPTER 278.**

AN ACT to amend the introductory portion of paragraph (c) of subsection (7) of section 29.33 of the statutes, relating to net fishing in outlying waters.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The introductory portion of paragraph (c) of subsection (7) of section 29.33 of the statutes is amended to read: (29.33) (7) (c) (Introductory portion) In Lake Michigan gill nets with a mesh of not less than four inches may be used for the purpose of taking lake trout and whitefish. Gill nets with a mesh of not less than two and one-half nor more than two and three-fourths inches may be used for the purpose of taking herring, chub \* \* \* and perch, until July 1, 1926; thereafter such mesh shall not be less than two and five-eighths inches. Gill nets with a mesh of not less than three and one-half nor more than four inches may be used for the taking of bluefin. Seines with a mesh of not less than three inches and pound nets with a mesh of not more than two inches in the pound may be used. No nets of any kind shall be set for the purpose of taking any variety of

fish during the close season for such fish. Any nets with a mesh between two and three-fourths and four inches are contraband, and shall be seized and confiscated whenever found in the water or on any vessel, dock or reel. Any such contraband nets so found shall be deemed sufficient evidence of the use of such nets by the owners thereof. All fish caught in nets whose use is permitted by this paragraph shall be deemed lawfully caught and possessed, except that no fish of any of the following varieties caught in seines, fyke or pound nets shall be retained, sold or transported of a length less than that specified for each variety, and such measurement of length shall be taken in a straight line from the tip of the nose to the utmost end of the tail fin, except that the measurement of dressed fish shall be the length of the carcass, namely:

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 279.

AN ACT to create section 352.365 of the statutes, relating to the manufacture and sale of oleomargarine and other substitutes for butter.

*The people of the State of Wisconsin, represented in Senate and Assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. A new section is added to the statutes to read: 352.365 (1) It shall be unlawful for any person, firm or corporation, by himself, his servant or agent, or as servant or agent of another, to manufacture, sell or solicit or accept orders for, ship, consign, offer or expose for sale or have in possession with intent to sell, any article, product or compound which is or may be used as a substitute for butter and which is made by combining with milk or milk fats or any of the derivatives of either any fat, oil or oleaginous substance or compound thereof other than milk fat.

(2) Any person violating this section shall, for the first offense, be punished by a fine of not less than fifty dollars nor more than five hundred dollars, and for each subsequent offense, by
