## CHAPTER 291.

- AN ACT to appropriate a sum of money therein named to John M. Ward, compensating him for damages resulting from an automobile collision with an employee of the Wisconsin industrial school for boys.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. There is appropriated from the general fund to John M. Ward, of Kenosha, Wisconsin, the sum of one hundred thirty-seven dollars thirty-seven cents to compensate him for damages resulting from an automobile collision with one C. S. Powell, an employee of the state industrial school for boys, located at Waukesha, Wisconsin. Acceptance of this appropriation shall operate as a full and complete release to the state of any claim on the part of said claimant for said damages.

## CHAPTER 292.

AN ACT to create subsection (21) of section 59.07 and subsection (32) of section 60.29 of the statutes, relating to powers of county and town boards.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 59.07 and a new subsection is added to section 60.29 of the statutes to be numbered and to read: (59.07) (21) To authorize the county treasurer to deed county-owned lands to towns having an excess

of delinquent real estate taxes to their credit in exchange for such credit. The county lands so conveyed shall not be valued at less than the face value of the certificates covering such lands.

(60.29) (32) The town board is empowered to authorize the town treasurer to exchange the town delinquent real estate tax credit existing with the county for county-owned lands.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

## CHAPTER 293.

AN ACT to create subsection (29) of section 60.29 of the statutes, relating to improvements in or on lakes by towns.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. A new subsection is added to section 60.29 of the statutes to read: (60.29) (29) The town board of any town may cause improvements to be made in any lake situated in such town. The expense of such work or improvement may be paid in whole or in part by the town or by the property to be benefited thereby as the town board may determine, but in no case shall the amount assessed to any parcel of real estate exceed the benefits accruing thereto by such improvement. Or whenever there is presented to the town board of any town a petition in writing signed by at least a majority of the owners of riparian property on any lake situated in said town, praying that said lake be improved as set forth in said petition, the town board shall make or cause to be made such improvements and shall assess benefits and damages against such riparian property in the manner provided in subsection (26) of this section, and the provisions of said subsection, so far as applicable, shall govern.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
