Relating to the death of Ex-President Coolidge.

JOINT RESOLUTION

Memorializing the Congress of the United States to give protection to American producers of wood pulp against unfair competition resulting from the depreciation of foreign currencies.

WHEREAS, The action of foreign countries which are large producers of wood pulp, in going off the gold standard, and the resulting depreciation in their currencies, has given foreign producers an unfair advantage over American producers and enabled them to flood the American market; and

WHEREAS, The effects of this situation are shown in the very great increase in the foreign wood pulp received at ports on the Great Lakes serving the Wisconsin and Michigan paper mills,
