**CHAPTER 17.**

AN ACT to amend 20.49 (1m) (a) and to create 20.60 (7) of the statutes, transferring the functions relating to conduct of a land economic survey from the state planning board to the department of agriculture, and making an appropriation.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Paragraph (a) of subsection (1m) of section 20.49 of the statutes is amended to read:

(20.49) (1m) (a) Annually, beginning July 1, 1937,  
\* \* \* \$50,000 to carry out the functions of the state planning board.

SECTION 2. Subsection (7) of section 20.60 of the statutes is created to read:

(20.60) (7) LAND ECONOMIC SURVEY. Annually, beginning July 1, 1941, \$15,000 for all necessary expenses incurred in the conduct, of a land economic survey, the preparation of maps, and the binding and distribution of reports.

SECTION 3. The intent of this act is to transfer to the department of agriculture the functions relating to the conduct of a land economic survey heretofore vested in the state planning board.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect July 1, 1941.

**CHAPTER 18.**

AN ACT relating to the authorization of the department of public welfare to grant an easement for poles at the state public school at Sparta to the Northern States Power Company.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. The department of public welfare is authorized and directed to enter into an agreement with the Northern States Power Company for the granting of an easement to con-

struct and install poles across the lands of the state public school at Sparta, Wisconsin, upon such terms and the payment of such consideration as may be deemed advisable, subject to the approval of the governor.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.

### CHAPTER 19.

AN ACT to amend 94.20 (1) of the statutes, relating to noxious weeds.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. Subsection (1) of section 94.20 of the statutes is amended to read: (94.20) (1) The term "noxious weeds" as used herein shall include the following: Class I, Canadian thistle, marijuana that is not grown or cultivated for lawful commercial purposes, English Charlock, or wild mustard, goats-beard, quack or quitch grass, *creeping jenny*; Class II, field dodder, Indian mustard, oxeye daisy, snapdragon or butter and eggs, and perennial sow thistle. Every person shall destroy, or cut upon all lands which he shall own, occupy, or control, all weeds named in Class I at such time and in such manner as shall effectually prevent them from bearing seed, or spreading to adjoining property. In case of weeds having underground rootstocks and where the destruction of weeds in standing crops will result in the sacrifice of the crops, the department may determine the time and method of eradication.

SECTION 2. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
