CHAPTER 99.

AN ACT to make provision to enable the surviving members of the Grand Army of the Republic to attend the national encampment to be held at Columbus, Ohio, and its environs in the month of September, 1941, and making an appropriation therefor.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All surviving members of the Grand Army of the Republic who now reside in this state are entitled to attend the national encampment to be held at Columbus, Ohio, and its environs in September, 1941.

SECTION 2. All applications of such members desiring to avail themselves of the provisions of this act shall be made to the adjutant general of this state, who, upon receiving any such application, shall satisfy himself as to the qualifications of such applicant, and, upon being so satisfied, shall make provisions for his transportation, including sleeping berths and meals, from his home to Columbus, Ohio, and return, under such reasonable rules and regulations as he may adopt.

SECTION 3. There is appropriated from the general fund to the adjutant general on July 1, 1941, a sum sufficient, but not to exceed \$1,000 to pay all the actual and necessary expenses which, in his judgment, may be necessary to properly provide for and pay all transportation costs, necessary care and entertainment of all such members described in section 1 of this act who attend such national encampment, from their homes to Columbus, aforesaid, and return.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect upon passage and publication.
