CHAPTER 125.

AN ACT to create 16.33 (1) (o) and (p) of the statutes, relating to positions in the unclassified civil service in counties having civil service pursuant to sections 16.31 to 16.44 of the statutes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

16.33 (1) (o) and (p) of the statutes are created to read:

16.33 (1) (o) Students and internes in medical or professional specialties.

(p) Residents in the medical specialties.

CHAPTER 126.

AN ACT to create 16.353 of the statutes, relating to the employment of physically handicapped persons in the civil service of populous counties during the existing national emergency.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

16.353 of the statutes is created to read:

16.353 EMPLOYMENT OF HANDICAPPED SERVICES. For the duration of the existing national emergency and until the same shall have been officially terminated by proclamation of the President or Congress of the United States, the county board of supervisors may by ordinance authorize and direct the civil service commission to fill vacancies in the classified service by employment of physically handicapped persons, in cases where such handicap would prevent them from passing the regular civil service physical examination and does not in the opinion of a qualified physician selected by the civil service commission, impair the efficiency of the applicant in performing the work required by more than 50 percent, and where such physician shall certify that such handicapped person does not possess an organic disability which is likely to be aggravated by such employment. The county board may set up such classifications for such employes and provide such compensation therefor as it deems

proper. Persons so employed shall not be eligible to membership in or receive any benefits under the employes' retirement system, if any, in such county. The employment of such handicapped persons shall cease at once upon the official termination of the existing emergency.

CHAPTER 127.

AN ACT to create 253.26 (3) of the statutes, relating to special terms of county courts in certain counties.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

253.26 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

253.26 (3) Any such county judge so authorized to keep his office and hold special terms of such county court and transact business at any such city as above provided may, when such city is located partly in the county for which such judge was elected, and partly in an adjoining county in this state, keep his office and hold such terms of court and transact any business which might be done at any regular term, within that part of such city in the county adjoining such county for which such judge was so elected, and may compel the attendance of witnesses and issue subpoenas and citations ordering and compelling the attendance of parties and witnesses at such office or place of holding such special term within such adjoining county, and may there transact any and all business which might be done at, or which may be continued from any regular term to such special term so held by order of such county judge within such adjoining county.
