TAKE NOTICE

On October, 19....., and the next succeeding days,, Treasurer of.....county, will in his office in the courthouse, (county seat), Wisconsin, sell at public auction so much as may be necessary of each tract of land upon which the taxes have been returned as delinquent and are on said date still unpaid, for the payment of the taxes and interest due thereon. This sale will include all real estate listed in the county treasurer's official roll of delinquent taxes for the tax levy year, except public lands held on contract and lands mortgaged to the state. If you are in doubt as to whether the taxes on your land are paid, consult the county treasurer.

PAY YOUR TAXES NOW.

By so doing you will prevent sale of your property for taxes and you will stop the further addition of interest charges.

CHAPTER 134.

AN ACT to create 59.08 (45) and 66.051 of the statutes, granting powers to counties and municipalities to enact blackout ordinances.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 59.08 (45) of the statutes is created to read:
(59.08) (45) Enact ordinances regulating blackouts (including uniform air raid signals), providing penalties for violations

thereof, providing for the appointment and removal of air raid wardens and specifying their powers, and providing for precautionary measures to minimize injury to life and property and to protect and care for persons and property in the event of an air raid.

SECTION 2. 66.051 of the statutes is created to read:

66.051 Towns, villages and cities may enact blackout ordinances and in that respect shall have the powers granted to counties by section 59.08 (45), but in case of conflict between local and county ordinances, the county ordinance shall prevail.

CHAPTER 135.

AN ACT relating to the reconditioning and completing the silver service set used on the old battleship "Wisconsin" for presentation to the United States Navy for the new battleship "Wisconsin", and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

There is appropriated from the general fund \$7,500 to recondition the silver service set used on the old battleship "Wisconsin" and acquiring additional pieces to complete the set, which is to be presented to the United States Navy for use on the new battleship "Wisconsin" to be launched in 1943. Expenditures from this appropriation shall be on vouchers approved by the governor.
