

(2) The diagnostic center shall be so administered as to furnish a complete physical and mental inventory of each individual committed to the care and custody of the department of public welfare, thereby assuring commitment to the institution best suited to care for his particular case, development of the most effective curative or rehabilitative procedures in such case, and the most effective coordination of all the institutional facilities provided by the state. For the purposes of coordination between the department of public welfare and the medical school of the university an administrative committee is created to be composed of the president of the university, the chairman of the state board of public welfare, the dean of the medical school, and the director of the department of public welfare.

### CHAPTER 502.

AN ACT to amend 72.02 (1) of the statutes, relating to the tax on inheritances received by adopted children.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

72.02 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

72.02 (1) Where the person or persons entitled to any beneficial interest in such property shall be the husband, wife, lineal issue, lineal ancestor, brother or sister, or a descendant of a brother or sister of the decedent, a wife or widow of a son, or the husband of a daughter of the decedent, or any child *legally* adopted \* \* \*, or any child to whom such decedent for not less than 10 years prior to such transfer stood in the mutually acknowledged relation of a parent, provided, however, such relationship began at or before the child's fifteenth birthday, and was continuous for said 10 years thereafter, or any lineal issue of such adopted or mutually acknowledged child, at the rate of 2 per centum of the clear value of such interest in such property. *The terms lineal issue, lineal ancestor, brother, sister, descendant, son and daughter shall include such relationship established through such legal adoption.*
