CHAPTER 245.

- AN ACT to renumber and amend 46.03 (11) and to amend 46.015, 46.016, 54.03 (2) and 54.04 (1) of the statutes, relating to the administration of child welfare and youth services.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 46.015 of the statutes is amended to read:
46.015 The department shall be organized to include a deputy director and the following divisions: mental hygiene, corrections, * * * children and youth, public as-

sistance, and business management. The director may, with the approval of the board, allocate and reallocate departmental functions and institutions among these divisions.

Section 2. 46.016 of the statutes is amended to read:

46.016 The department may co-operate with the United States in carrying out federal acts concerning public assistance, social security, child welfare and youth services, mental hygiene and corrections, services for the blind, and in other matters of mutual concern pertaining to public welfare.

Section 3. The subsection heading of section 46.03 (7) of the statutes is revised to read:

"CHILDREN AND YOUTH."

Section 4. 46.03 (11) of the statutes is renumbered 46.03 (7) (d) and amended

46.03 (7) (d) * * * Administer the program of youth services as provided in chapter 54. The treatment program provided in sections 54.08 to 54.38 and the treatment and correctional facilities administered by the department for youth, including the Wisconsin school for boys, the Wisconsin school for girls, and the Wisconsin child center, may be allocated to the division * * * for children and youth at the discretion of the board.

Section 5. 54.03 (2) of the statutes is amended to read:

54.03 (2) "Division" means the division * * * for children and youth in the department of public welfare created by section 54.04 (1).

Section 6. 54.04 (1) of the statutes is amended to read: 54.04 (1) There shall be created a division * * * for children and youth in the department of public welfare.
