## CHAPTER 631.

AN ACT to amend 66.99 (1) (a), (4) and (8) of the statutes, as created by chapter 60, laws of 1951, relating to the inclusion of public personnel under the federal old-age and survivors insurance system.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 66.99 (1) (a), (4) and (8) of the statutes, as created by chapter 60, laws of 1951, are amended to read:

66.99 (1) (a) "Public agency" means the state and any county, city, village, town, school district or other unit of government, or agency or instrumentality of one or more thereof which is eligible for inclusion under the federal old age and survivors insurance system.

(4) The director with the approval of the governor shall pursuant to subsection (3) or upon the submission to him of a certified copy of a resolution adopted by the governing body of any public agency in accordance with subsection (2), execute upon behalf of the state an agreement or modification of an agreement, with the federal social security administrator for the inclusion of a coverage group of the employes and officers of such public agency under the federal old age and survivors insurance system established by federal regulations in conformity with such resolution or in conformity with subsection (3) and in conformity with federal regulations. The state and each public agency included under such agreement or modification thereof shall be bound by federal regulations, and by rules and regulations promulgated under subsection (11) including any regulation requiring payment of interest \* \* \*.

(8) Whenever any public agency shall fail to remit within \* \* \* the period fixed by rules and regulations promulgated under subsection (11) any sum payable under subsection (7) the director shall certify to the director of budget and accounts such sums as may be necessary to reimburse the state for all amounts which it may have paid for such public agency, and any interest which it may have paid thereon, and such shall be included in the next apportionment of state special charges to local units of government.

SECTION 2. In sections 20.99 (1) and (2) and 66.99 (9) and (10) of the statutes (created by chapter 60, laws of 1951) the phrase "public employes social security fund" is substituted for "contribution fund"; the revisor of statutes shall show such changes in publishing the statutes.
