CHAPTER 297

AN ACT to amend 85.06 (15) (a) of the statutes, relating to the requirement that all new motor vehicles sold after January 1, 1954, be equipped with directional signal lights.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

85.06 (15) (a) of the statutes is amended to read:

85.06 (15) (a) Any vehicle may be equipped, and * * * *all new motor vehicles sold in the state on or after January 1, 1955, and those otherwise* required under this chapter, shall be equipped, with direction signal lamps for the purpose of giving a signal of intention to turn right or left. Such lamps shall project a flashing white or amber light visible to the front and a red or amber flashing light visible to the rear. Direction signal lamps shall be plainly visible and understandable from a distance of 100 feet both during normal sunlight and during hours of darkness.
