CHAPTER 109

- AN ACT to repeal 93.07 (19); to amend 95.52 (1); and to create 95.515 of the statutes, relating to appointment of the board of veterinary examiners.
- The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 93.07 (19) of the statutes is repealed and the positions of veterinary examiners as they existed immediately prior to the taking effect of this act are abolished.

SECTION 2. 95.515 of the statutes is created to read:

95.515 BOARD OF VETERINARY EXAMINERS. The director shall appoint a board of veterinary examiners consisting of 5 members, all of whom shall be licensed, resident doctors of veterinary medicine. Such members shall hold office for 5 years and until their successors are appointed. The first appointments shall be for 1, 2, 3, 4 and 5 years, respectively. No person shall be a member who is in any way connected with or financially interested in any school having a veterinary department. The Wisconsin veterinary medical association may submit a list of at least 3 qualified nominees for any vacancy on the board. The director may request additional lists of nominees. Appointments shall be made from lists so submitted.

SECTION 3. 95.52 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

95.52 (1) Licenses to engage in the practice of veterinary medicine and surgery shall be issued only to persons who successfully pass an examination conducted under direction of the board of veterinary examiners * * *. The time and place of such examination shall be fixed by the board.

SECTION 4. This act shall take effect January 1, 1956.
