

CHAPTER 543

AN ACT to create 20.005 (2) (a) (lines 496k to 496q) of the statutes, to appropriate \$47,326.70 from the general fund to Roland J. Casper, Allen G. Onnink, Frank Patrick and Norma Patrick, Eugene Farley, Calvin Roth and the cities of Manitowoc and Kewaunee for payment of claims made by them against the state.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.005 (2) (a) (lines 496k to 496q) of the statutes are created to read:

SECTION 2. There is appropriated from the general fund \$47,326.70 to the persons named herein in the respective amounts set forth above in payment of the claims made by such persons against the state. The nature of the various claims is as follows: Roland J. Casper suffered damages as a result of an automobile accident on June 11, 1955, involving a vehicle operated by the Wisconsin National Guard. Allen G. Onnink suffered damages as a result of an automobile accident on May 20, 1956, involving a vehicle operated by the Wisconsin National Guard. Frank Patrick and Norma Patrick suffered damages as a result of a fire set on December 28, 1955, by a ward of the state. Eugene Farley suffered damages as a result of a defective manhole cover in a driveway upon the grounds of Northern State Colony and Training School. Calvin Roth had \$378.53 in his account at Northern State Colony and Training School when he left that institution, and the money has not been repaid to him. The cities of Manitowoc and Kewaunee received from the state in the years 1948 through 1953 no distribution of taxes assessed against car ferry properties in those cities. Acceptance of these appropriations shall operate as a full and complete release to the state for any claim on account of such damages.
