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CHAPTER 609

AN ACT relating to this state conveying to the city of Lake Geneva submerged lands, therein described, beneath the waters of Lake Geneva for the purpose of erecting a breakwater providing a safe harbor for the mooring of boats and for navigation purposes.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. All right, title and interest of this state in and to lands of sufficient width submerged beneath the waters of Lake Geneva is hereby conveyed to the city of Lake Geneva for the purpose of erecting thereon a breakwater which will provide a safe harbor for the mooring of boats and for navigation purposes, the center line and length of the breakwater to be as specified in the following description:

Commencing at a point in the east line of South Broad Street of the city of Lake Geneva, Walworth county, Wisconsin, which is 45.0 feet southeasterly of the intersection of the east line of Center Street of said city, and the easterly line of said South Broad Street, thence S. 81° 45′ W., 120 feet to the shore of Lake Geneva, thence N. 81° 45′ W., 100 feet to the place of beginning of the breakwater, thence N. 81° 45′ W., 500 feet to its terminus; also commencing at a point in the south line of Main Street of said city, 162 feet west of the point of intersection of the south extension of the west line of Maxwell Street of said city and the aforesaid south line of Main Street, thence South 260 feet to the shore of Lake Geneva, thence S. 76° 30′ E., 1200 feet to its terminus.

SECTION 2. The breakwater shall have openings and bridges as may be prescribed by the public service commission and plans for the structure shall be approved by said commission. The width of the top surface of the breakwater structure shall not be more than 75 feet.
