## Chapter 563

AN ACT to amend 20.610 (1) (g), as affected by chapter 163, laws of 1965, and 151.015 (1), as created by chapter 351, laws of 1965; and to create 20.605 of the statutes, relating to the appropriation for the pharmacy internship commission.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. 20.610 (1) (g) of the statutes, as affected by chapter 163, laws of 1965, is amended to read:

20.610 (1) (g) All moneys received under ch. 151, except as provided in s. 20.605.

SECTION 2. 20.605 of the statutes is created to read:

20.605 PHARMACY INTERNSHIP COMMISSION. There is appropriated to the pharmacy internship commission for the following program:

(1) SUPERVISION OF INTERNSHIP PROGRAM. (g) Earmarked portion of fees. That portion of each fee collected under s. 151.02 (3) set aside for the use of the internship commission.

SECTION 3. 151.015 (1) of the statutes, as created by chapter 351, laws of 1965, is amended to read:

151.015 (1) There is created an a pharmacy internship commission of 13 members as follows: the president of the board of pharmacy who shall serve as chairman of the commission; the 4 other members of the board; 4 members of the faculty of the university of Wisconsin school of pharmacy designated by the dean of the school; and 4 additional members selected by the Wisconsin pharmaceutical association. All successor members of the commission, except the members of the board, shall serve 4-year terms. The names of the members of the commission shall be certified to the secretary of state by the secretary of the commission. Members shall hold office until their successors have been selected. Members of the commission shall receive no compensation, but shall be reimbursed for expenses necessarily incurred by them in attending meetings of the commission outside the county of their residence. The commission shall elect a vice chairman and a secretary. The commission shall determine the qualifications of and appoint a full-time director of internship and such technical and clerical help as it deems necessary outside the classified service.
