## 1985 Wisconsin Act 301

AN ACT to renumber 346.075; to amend 346.075 (title); and to create 346.075 (2) and 346.48 (3) of the statutes, relating to overtaking and passing a stopped motor bus or school bus and providing a penalty.

*The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:*

SECTION 1. 346.075 (title) of the statutes is amended to read:

**346.075 (title) Overtaking and passing bicycles and motor buses.**

SECTION 2. 346.075 of the statutes is renumbered 346.075 (1).

SECTION 3. 346.075 (2) of the statutes is created to read:

346.075 (2) Except as provided in s. 346.48, if the operator of a motor vehicle overtakes a motor bus which is stopped at an intersection on the right side of the roadway and is receiving or discharging passen-

gers, the operator shall pass at a safe distance to the left of the motor bus and shall not turn to the right in front of the motor bus at that intersection.

SECTION 3m. 346.48 (3) of the statutes is created to read:

346.48 (3) If the operator of a motor vehicle overtakes a school bus which is stopped and is loading or unloading pupils or other authorized passengers at an intersection on the right side of a roadway in a business or residence district in which the display of the flashing red warning lights on the school bus is not permitted, the operator shall pass at a safe distance to the left of the school bus and shall not turn to the right in front of the school bus at that intersection.

SECTION 4. **Cross-reference changes.** In the sections of the statutes listed in Column A, the cross-references shown in Column B are changed to the cross-references shown in Column C:

SECTION 5. **Effective date.** This act takes effect on the first day of the 3rd month commencing after its publication.
