1993 Wisconsin Act 338

(Vetoed in Part)

AN ACT relating to creating a committee to study the feasibility of establishing a regional high school of excellence and making an appropriation.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

SECTION 1. Nonstatutory provisions; high school of excellence. There is established a committee to study the feasibility of establishing a regional high school of excellence for academically talented students in the areas of science and mathematics and to solicit corporate and public support to pay for the initial costs of establishing such a high school. The governor shall appoint one-half of the members of the committee and the state superintendent of public instruction shall appoint one-half of the members of the committee. The committee shall report its findings and recommendations to the governor by June 30, 1994. The committee terminates on June 30, 1994.

SECTION 2. Appropriation changes; high school of excellence. (1) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of administration under section 20.505 (3) (a) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1993, the dollar amount is increased by \$37,000 for fiscal year 1993-94 for the expenses of the committee appointed to study the feasibility of establishing a regional high school of excellence under this act.

(2) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation to the department of public instruction under section 20.255 (2) (dt) of the statutes, as affected by the acts of 1993, the dollar amount is decreased by \$37,000 for fiscal year 1993-94 to reduce funding for pupil assessment.
