FEE SCHEDULE

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History: Chapter Ind 69 as it existed on September 30, 1970 was repealed and a new chapter Ind 69 was created, Register, September, 1970, No. 177, effective October 1, 1970.

Ind 69.01 Scope. The fees fixed in this code shall be assessed and collected by the department of industry, labor and human relations for the inspection of boilers, unfired pressure vessels, and refrigeration plants for the examination and certification of boiler and elevator inspectors employed by insurance companies; for the examination and approval of building plans and component parts of buildings, for plan examination and the inspection of elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps and personnel hoists and for all other services for which authority to fix and collect fees is provided in section 101.10 (12) and (13) and 101.102 (2), Wis. Stats.

Ind 69.02 Boiler inspections. (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, a boiler shall be rated at 10 square feet of heating surface per horsepower.

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Ind 69.03 Unfired pressure vessel inspections. (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, the size of an unfired pressure vessel shall be its cubic content in terms of cubic feet.

Ind 69.031 Insurance company assessment: boilers, pressure vessels and major repairs.

(1) When an inspection report filed by a certified inspector employed by an insurance company is found to be incomplete, invalid, or unacceptable for any reason, the Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations may inspect the installation and assess the insurance company according to the fee schedules in section Ind 69,02, section Ind 69.03, and section Ind 69.06.

Ind 69.04 Mechanical refrigeration systems. (1) For the purpose of assessing the inspection fee, the capacity of a mechanical refrigeration system shall be determined in tons. One ton of refrigeration capacity shall be the equivalent of abstracting heat at the rate of 12,000 BTU per hour.

Ind 69.05 Certificate of operation for boilers, pressure vessels, and mechanical refrigerator systems. The department of industry, labor and human relations shall issue a certificate of operation for each boiler or refrigeration system or one more unfired pressure vessels as covered in Wis. Adm. Code chapter 41, section 41.28 upon receipt of an inspection report showing the equipment satisfies minimum operating standards specified in chapters 41 and 45. A fee of \$3.00 shall be assessed the owner for the issuance of each certificate of operation.

Ind 69.06 Wisconsin special vessel plan examinations and approvals. (1) Plans showing design and construction details, design computations and specifications for materials for any one boiler or unfired pressure vessel submitted for examination and approval according to Wis. Adm. chapter 41, section Ind 41.51 shall be accompanied by a fee in the amount determined by subsection (2).

Ind 69.07 Registration Fees: Boilers, Pressure Vessels, and Mechanical Refrigeration Systems. (1) The installing contractor of a new or secondhand boiler, pressure vessel, or mechanical refrigeration system shall register such installations with the department of industry, labor and human relations before placing such installations in operation. The registration fee is \$5.

Ind 69.08 Anhydrous ammonia systems. (1) The owner or user shall shall remit an approval fee with each plot plan submitted for new or additional facilities for handling or storing anhydrous ammonia. The approval fee is \$25.

Ind 69.09 Major repair reports for boilers and pressure vessels. (1) An owner reporting major repairs or alterations to boilers or pressure vessels as required by provisions of Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 42.01 (2) shall remit a fee of \$5 with each major repair report.

Ind 69.10 Plan examinations, approvals, inspections, and fees. (1) Plans showing design and construction details, design computations, and specifications submitted for examination and approval as required by Wis. Adm. Code chapters Ind 20, 46, and 50 through 59 shall/be accompanied by a fee in the amount determined by subsection (3).

(2) For the purpose of arriving at the examination and approval fee for building plans and for heating and ventilation plans, the size of a building shall be the total cubical volume determined by the overall outside dimensions of length, width, and height.

(3) Plan examination and approval fees for the listed types of construction shall be assessed and collected as follows:

 30¢ per 1,000 cubic feet Minimum fee—\$12 per plan
20¢ per 1,000 cubic feet Minimum fee—\$6 per plan (a) General building plans (b) Heating and ventilation plans Note: The simple replacement of a boiler or a furnace in an existing heating system with no alterations to the heating system requires no fee. (c) Miscellaneous plans: 1. Stadia, grandstands and bleachers_______\$6 per 1,000 seats or fraction of 1,000 seats \$6 per fire escape and spray coating_ \$6 per system (d) Plans for alterations and repairs for building and structures___\$1.10 for every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 estimated costs. Minimum fee-\$6. (Estimate need not include costs of razing, plumbing electrical, painting or decorating.)

(5) An inspection fee of \$15 (Authority—section 101.102 Wis. Stats.) shall be collected for each inspection of a facility conducted to insure that the construction is in accordance with plans approved for the facility. The fee shall be paid at the time plans are submitted.

Any other inspections not listed under Section Ind 69.10 (3) require one inspection fee of \$15.

Ind 69.20 Elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps, and personnel hoists; plan examinations and approvals. (1) Plans for elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps, and personnel hoists shall be submitted for each installation in compliance with Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 4.04, (elevators); and Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 44.01, (personnel hoists).

(2) The plan examination and approval fee for each installation shall be assessed and collected as outlined in this schedule:

Ind 69.25 Elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, and personnel hoists inspections. (1) An inspection fee shall be assessed and collected for each installation of a passenger, freight and material handling elevator, personnel hoists, power dumbwaiter, escalator, moving walk, and moving ramp as classified in this schedule.

(a) Class 1. Freight elevators (single belt, double belt and cable control elevators) with 4 landings or less, sidewalk elevators, sidewalk type elevators and grade level elevators. \$15

(2) When inspection reports filed by a certified inspector employed by an insurance company are found to be incomplete, invalid or unacceptable for any reason, the department of industry, labor and

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human relations may inspect the installation and assess the insurance company according to the schedule in section Ind 69.25 (1).

Ind 69.30 Shop inspections. (1) Inspection of boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, dumbwaiters, moving ramps, personnel hoists, and similar devices, and parts of such devices, may be provided at reasonable times and at the place of manufacture on request, but only when deemed by the department of industry, labor and human relations to be essential and necessary.

(2) Fees to be assessed and collected for shop inspections shall be as follows:

Ind 69.50 Certificates of competency. (1) Insurance company employes eligible in accordance with the provisions of the applicable administrative code, to be examined for competency as a boiler inspector or as an elevator inspector shall submit with the proper application forms an examination fee of \$30.

(a) Boiler inspectors receiving a reciprocal "certificate of competency" by qualifying as a member of the "National Board of Boiler and Unfired Pressure Vessel Inspectors" shall submit with their application form a fee of \$25.

(b) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination need not submit an additional examination fee when application for reexamination is filed within 12 months from the date of the previous examination.

(2) The annual renewal fee for certificates of competency shall be \$10.

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Ind 69.70 Storage Tanks: Anhydrous Ammonia, Flammable and Combustible Liquids, Liquefied Petroleum Gas, and Liquefied Natural Gas. (1) A fee shall be assessed and collected for the review and approval of plans according to the following table:

(2) A fee of \$15.00 shall be assessed and collected, at the time of plan approval, for inspection of new or additional tanks at each bulk plant, service station, or other location.
