**TEMPORARY LICENSE TO PRACTICE
MEDICINE AND SURGERY**

Med 8.01 Application for permanent license required. Realizing that permanent licenses to practice medicine and surgery are issued at scheduled meetings of the board, holders of temporary licenses are obligated to apply for a permanent license at the next meeting of the board for which they are eligible. However, the issuance of a temporary license does not bind the board to issue a permanent license to anyone granted a temporary license.

Med 8.02 Expiration. A temporary license shall, according to statute, be issued to those properly qualified and on certification of necessity by 2 officers of the board. The temporary license shall expire 30 days after the next examination for which the applicant is qualified, or on the first day of that examination if applicant does not so apply.

Med 8.03 Recommendation required by responsible organization or individual. Establishment of the "emergency need" shall be aided by the recommendation of the medical society, supervisor or departmental head of a hospital or other institution, or private practitioner. Final decision will rest with the board or its duly elected officers.

Med 8.04 Fee. A fee of \$25 shall be charged for each permit issued.

Med 8.05 Modification of basic science requirement. Applicants for temporary permits shall submit an application on a form provided by the board; each application shall be accompanied by a further application and fee for a permanent license to practice medicine and surgery in Wisconsin, either by written examination or reciprocity as determined by the board, with the exception of a Wisconsin basic science certificate, which provision is suspended to the extent that the issuance of such a certificate is not immediately required, but application for this certificate must have been accepted by the Wisconsin basic science board.

Med 8.06 Revocation. A violation of any provision of the temporary license code, of the regulations governing their issuance, or of section 147.20 or 147.205 of the medical practice act, shall constitute cause for revocation of such temporary license.

Med 8.07 Requirements. Applicant must meet all regular licensure requirements found in the board regulations and in the medical practice act for the type of application for permanent license for

which he is found eligible, with the exception of a Wisconsin basic science certificate, for which, however, application must have been accepted by the Wisconsin basic science board.

Med 8.08 No provision for renewal. A temporary license cannot be renewed under any conditions.

Med 8.09 Practice limitations. The holder of such a temporary license may engage in the regular practice of medicine and surgery according to Wisconsin Statutes, providing such practice is confined to the institution or area for which the permit is issued.
