Opt 4.01 Time and place. The board of examiners shall fix a time and place for the examinations.

Opt 4.02 Subjects. Examinations shall relate to such matters as are essential to the practice of optometry, and shall include anatomy, physiology, pathology of the eyes and its appendages, muscular conditions and coordination of the eyes, and subjective and objective optometry, and principles of lens construction and adjustment and such other subjects as the board shall deem necessary.

Opt 4.03 Unauthorized assistance. An applicant who gives or receives unauthorized assistance during the written, oral or clinical examination shall be dismissed from the examination. Future consideration of such dismissal shall be in the discretion of the board.

Opt 4.04 Controls. Time limits and other necessary controls may be announced by the president of the board or the examiner prior to the examinations.

Opt 4.05 Clinical examination. The board may conduct a practical clinical examination if deemed advisable. This examination may be conducted in conjunction with the regular and written examination or may be held later at a time and place announced by the president of the board. The board may admit all applicants to this practical examination or may limit it to only those who were successful in the written examination. The practical examination may consist of an actual demonstration of the applicant's ability to perform all or part of an optometric examination with the accompanying phases of optometric service and written and oral examination as the board sees fit.
