## ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 27, TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 557

October 5, 1995 – Offered by Representatives Robson, Wood, Kreuser, Wirch, Wilder, Plache, Ryba and Baumgart.

1	At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:
2	1. Page 4, line 19: delete "Transit" and substitute "Small communities
3	transit"; and decrease the dollar amount for fiscal year 1995–96 by \$17,148,900 and
4	decrease the dollar amount for fiscal year 1996-97 by \$69,181,500 to decrease
5	funding for the purpose for which the appropriation is made.
6	${f 2.}$ Page 5, line 1: delete "Demand management and" and substitute
7	"Medium-sized communities transit operating aids".
8	<b>3.</b> Page 5, line 2: delete "ride-sharing grants"; and increase the dollar amount
9	for fiscal year 1995–96 by \$4,025,000 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year
10	1996-97 by \$17,185,100 to increase funding for the purpose for which the
11	appropriation is made.
12	<b>4.</b> Page 5, line 4: delete "Supplemental" and substitute "Large communities".

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1	5. Page 5, line 5: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 1995–96 by
2	\$12,230,800 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 1996–97 by \$52,272,000
3	to increase funding for the purpose for which the appropriation is made.
4	<b>6.</b> Page 5, line 21: after that line insert:
5	"(ds) Demand management and
6	ride-sharing grants, state funds SEG A 300,000 300,000".
7	<b>7.</b> Page 14, line 9: after that line insert:

15	The amounts in the schedule for mass transit aids to medium-sized communities
16	under s. 85.20 (4m) (a) 2.
17	<b>SECTION 6.</b> 20.395 (1) (bu) of the statutes is amended to read:
18	20.395 (1) (bu) (title) <i>Supplemental Large communities transit operating aids,</i>
19	<i>state funds</i> . The amounts in the schedule for <del>the</del> mass transit <del>aid program</del> <u>aids to</u>
20	<u>large communities</u> under s. 85.20 (4m) <del>(am)</del> <u>(a) 3</u> .".

<b>2</b>	an amount equal to 42% of the projected operating expenses of each eligible
3	applicant's urban mass transit system <u>An amount</u> shall be allocated to each eligible
4	applicant <del>.</del> <u>to ensure that the sum of state and federal aids for the projected operating</u>
5	expenses of each eligible applicant's urban mass transit system is equal to a uniform
6	percentage, established by the department, of the projected operating expenses of
7	the mass transit system. The department shall make allocations as follows:
8	<b>SECTION 63.</b> 85.20 $(4m)$ (a) 1. to 3. of the statutes are created to read:
9	85.20 (4m) (a) 1. From the appropriation under s. $20.395$ (1) (bq), the uniform
10	percentage for an urban mass transit system operating within an urban area having
11	a population as shown in the 1990 federal decennial census of less than 50,000.
12	2. From the appropriation under s. $20.395(1)$ (bs), the uniform percentage for
13	an urban mass transit system operating within an urban area having a population
14	as shown in the 1990 federal decennial census of at least 50,000 but not more than
15	200,000 and meeting the federal definition of urbanized area for the purpose of
16	federal mass transit aid.
17	3. From the appropriation under s. $20.395(1)$ (bu), the uniform percentage for
18	an urban mass transit system operating within an urban area having a population
19	as shown in the 1990 federal decennial census of more than 200,000 and meeting the
20	federal definition of urbanized area for the purpose of federal mass transit aid.
21	SECTION 64. 85.20 (4m) (am) of the statutes is repealed.
22	<b>SECTION 65.</b> 85.20 $(4m)$ (e) of the statutes is repealed.
23	<b>SECTION 66.</b> 85.20 (4m) (em) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:

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1	85.20 (4m) (em) 1. An amount equal to $42%$ the same percentage of the audited
2	operating expenses for the project year of the applicant's urban mass transit system
3	that is specified for allocations to the applicant under par. (a) 1. to 3.
4	<b>SECTION 67.</b> 85.20 (4s) of the statutes is amended to read:
5	85.20 (4s) Payment of aids under the contract. The contracts executed
6	between the department and eligible applicants under this section shall provide that
7	the payment of the state aid allocation under sub. $\left(4m\right)\left(a\right)$ for the last quarter of the
8	state's fiscal year shall be provided from the following fiscal year's appropriation
9	under s. 20.395 (1) (bq) <u>, (bs) or (bu)</u> .
10	SECTION 68. 85.20 (7) of the statutes is created to read:
11	85.20 (7) COST-EFFICIENCY STANDARDS. (a) The department shall establish
12	cost-efficiency standards for the urban mass transit system specified in sub. $(4m)$ $(a)$
13	1. to 3. The contracts executed between the department and eligible applicants
14	under this section for any period beginning on or after January 1, 1997, shall provide
15	that the department may do any of the following if costs are incurred by the eligible
16	applicant's urban mass transit system which are inconsistent with the standards
17	established under this subsection:
18	1. Exclude those costs from operating expenses for purposes of sub. $(4m)$ .
19	2. Reduce the amount of state aid allocation under sub. $(4m)$ (a).
20	(b) The department shall specify by rule the cost-efficiency standards under
21	this subsection, including rules for the implementation of par. (a) 1. and 2.".

1	85.24 (3) (d) (intro.) The department may award grants from the appropriation
2	under s. 20.395 (1) (bs) (ds) to public and private organizations for the development
3	and implementation of demand management and ride-sharing programs. As a
4	condition of obtaining a grant under this paragraph, a public or private organization
5	may be required to provide matching funds at any percentage. The department shall
6	give priority in the awarding of grants to those programs that provide the greatest
7	reduction in automobile trips, especially during peak hours of traffic congestion. The
8	department shall have all powers necessary and convenient to implement this
9	paragraph, including the following powers:".

18	creation of sections 20.395 (1) (bs) and 85.20 (4m) (a) 1. to 3. of the statutes take effect
19	on January 1, 1996.".
