- **2.** Page 47, line 14: after that line insert:
- "Section 143g. 343.022 of the statutes is created to read:
- 343.022 Use of social security numbers. (1) Except as provided in s. 343.14 (2) (bm), the department may not require an individual, for the purposes of chs. 340 to 349 and 351, to disclose his or her social security number, but may request an individual to disclose his or her social security number to assist the department in accessing his or her records if the department informs the individual that he or she may refuse to disclose the number.
- (2) The department may not disclose any social security number collected under chs. 340 to 349 and 351. This subsection does not apply to the disclosure of a social security number to a law enforcement agency, as defined in s. 165.83 (1) (b), a federal governmental agency or an agency of this state, to perform a legally authorized function. Any law enforcement agency, federal governmental agency or

2	not disclose that number except to perform a legally authorized function.".
3	3. Page 52, line 25: after that line insert:
4	"Section 162g. 343.14 (2) (b) of the statutes is amended to read:
5	343.14 (2) (b) The applicant's date of birth, social security number, color of eyes,
6	color of hair, sex, height, weight and race;
7	Section 162m. 343.14 (2) (bm) of the statutes is created to read:
8	343.14 (2) (bm) A space for the applicant to provide his or her social security
9	number, together with a prominent statement informing the applicant that he or she
10	is not required to disclose the number in order to obtain a license unless he or she
11	is applying for a commercial driver license;".
