1	<b>SECTION 2.</b> 15.406 (3) of the statutes is created to read:
2	15.406 (3) Massage therapists and bodyworkers affiliated credentialing
3	BOARD. (a) There is created in the department of regulation and licensing, attached
4	to the medical examining board, a massage therapists and bodyworkers affiliated
5	credentialing board. The affiliated credentialing board shall consist of the following
6	members appointed for 4-year terms:
7	1. Five massage therapists or bodyworkers who are certified under subch. V of
8	ch. 448 and have engaged in the practice of massage therapy or bodywork for at least
9	2 years preceding appointment.
10	2. Two public members.
11	(b) In appointing members under par. (a), the governor shall ensure, to the
12	maximum extent practicable, that the membership of the affiliated credentialing
13	board is diverse, based on all of the following factors:

15	2. Affiliation and nonaffiliation with a professional association for the practice
16	of massage therapy or bodywork.
17	3. Professional associations with which massage therapists or bodyworkers in
18	this state are affiliated.

Any Notwithstanding s. 448.951, any 11 person who, on July 11, 1953, was practicing massage and hydrotherapy in this state under a certificate of registration issued pursuant to s. 147.185, 1951 stats., as it 1213 existed prior to July 11, 1953, or who had applied for a certificate of registration in 14massage and hydrotherapy before said date, shall have the right to continue to so 15practice under such certificate, and the term "massage and hydrotherapy" shall be deemed to include the use of galvanic generator, diathermy, infrared ray and 16 17ultraviolet light for massage purposes. 6	448.95 Definitions. In this subchapter:
7	(1) "Adjunctive therapy" includes the use of a device that simulates or enhances
8	a manual action; the application of heat, cold, water, a mild abrasive or a topical
9	preparation; and heliotherapy.
10	(2) "Affiliated credentialing board" means the massage therapists and
11	bodyworkers affiliated credentialing board.
12	(3) "Manual action" includes holding, positioning, rocking, kneading,
13	compressing, decompressing, gliding or percussing the soft tissue of the human body
14	and applying friction to soft tissue.
15	(4) "Massage therapist or bodyworker" means a person who is certified as a
16	massage therapist or bodyworker under this subchapter.
17	(5) "Massage therapy or bodywork":
18	(a) Means the science and healing art that uses manual actions to palpate and
19	manipulate the soft tissue of the human body, and adjunctive therapies, to improve
20	circulation, reduce tension, relieve soft tissue pain, or increase flexibility, and
21	includes determining whether massage therapy or bodywork is appropriate or
22	contraindicated, or whether a referral to another health care practitioner is
23	appropriate.
24	(b) Does not include making a medical diagnosis.
25	(6) "Physician's office" has the meaning given in s. 101.123 (1) (dg).

1  $\mathbf{2}$  (7) "Sexual contact" has the meaning given in s. 939.22 (34).

(8) "Sexual intercourse" has the meaning given in s. 948.01 (7) (a).

3 448.951 Use of titles. Except as provided in s. 448.952, no person may 4 designate himself or herself as a massage therapist or bodyworker, use or assume the 5 title "massage therapist and bodyworker" or "massage therapist" or "bodyworker", 6 or append to the person's name the letters "M.T.", "C.M.T.", "B.W." or "C.B.W.", or use any other title or designation which represents or may tend to represent the person 7 8 as a massage therapist or bodyworker, unless the person is certified under this 9 subchapter.

**448.952** Applicability. A certificate under this subchapter is not required for 11 any of the following:

12(1) A person holding a license, permit, registration or certification granted by 13this state or the federal government who engages in a practice of massage therapy 14 or bodywork within the scope of his or her license, permit, registration or certification 15and who does not imply that he or she is a massage therapist or bodyworker.

16 (2) A massage therapy or bodywork student practicing massage therapy or 17bodywork, without compensation, within the scope of the student's education or 18 training.

19 (3) A massage therapist or bodyworker who is licensed, permitted, registered 20or certified to practice massage therapy or bodywork in another state or country and 21is providing a consultation to or demonstration with a massage therapist or 22bodyworker who is certified under this subchapter.

23(4) A person who restricts his or her manipulation of soft tissue to the hands 24or feet and who does not imply that he or she is a massage therapist or bodyworker.

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1	(5) A person who uses touch or spoken words to increase awareness of existing
2	or potential patterns of movement in the human body and who does not imply that
3	he or she is a massage therapist or bodyworker.
4	448.953 Duties of affiliated credentialing board. (1) The affiliated
5	credentialing board shall assign a unique certificate number to each person who is
6	certified under this subchapter.
7	(2) The affiliated credentialing board shall promulgate rules that establish all
8	of the following:
9	(a) A code of ethics that governs the professional conduct of massage therapists
10	or bodyworkers. The code of ethics shall prohibit a massage therapist or bodyworker
11	from having sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a client.
12	(b) Criteria for approving a school of massage therapy or bodywork from which
13	graduation is required under s. 448.954 (1) (e) 1. Rules promulgated under this
14	paragraph shall define the curricula and qualifications of instructors that are
15	required for approval of a school. The rules shall prohibit the approval of a school
16	unless the on-premises practice of massage therapy or bodywork by a massage
17	therapy or bodywork student is under the direct supervision of an instructor.
18	(c) Criteria for approving the courses of instruction required under s. 448.954
19	(1) (e) 2. and 3. Rules promulgated under this paragraph shall require the course of
20	instruction required under s. 448.954 (1) (e) 3. to consist of at least 500 classroom
21	hours.
22	(d) Requirements and procedures for obtaining the informed consent of a client
23	under s. 448.96 (1) and for making a report required under s. 448.961 (1).

(e) A definition of "sexually oriented business" for purposes of s. 448.96 (3).

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1	448.954 Certification of massage therapists or bodyworkers. (1) The
2	affiliated credentialing board shall grant a certificate as a massage therapist or
3	bodyworker to a person who satisfies all of the following:
4	(a) Is 18 years of age or older.
5	(b) Has graduated from high school or attained high school graduation
6	equivalency as determined by the department of public instruction under s. 115.29
7	(4).
8	(c) Submits an application for the certificate to the department on a form
9	provided by the department.
10	(d) Pays the fee specified in s. 440.05 (1).
11	(e) Except as provided in sub. (2), submits evidence satisfactory to the affiliated
12	credentialing board that he or she has done all of the following:
13	1. Graduated from a school of massage therapy or bodywork approved under
14	s. 39.51 and under rules promulgated under s. 448.953 (2) (b).
15	2. Completed at least 6 classroom hours in the laws of this state and rules of
16	the affiliated credentialing board relating to the practice of massage therapy or
17	bodywork in a course of instruction approved by the affiliated credentialing board.
18	3. Completed a minimum number of classroom hours, established by the
19	affiliated credentialing board by rule, in a course of instruction in the principles and
20	techniques of massage therapy or bodywork that is approved by the affiliated
21	credentialing board.
22	(f) Passes an examination under s. 448.955.
23	(g) Submits evidence satisfactory to the affiliated credentialing board that he

or she has in effect malpractice liability insurance coverage in an amount that is not
less than \$1,000,000 per occurence and \$1,000,000 for all occurrences in one year.

(2) The affiliated credentialing board may waive a requirement specified in
 sub. (1) (e) if a person establishes, to the satisfaction of the affiliated credentialing
 board, that he or she has education, training or other experience that is substantially
 equivalent to the requirement.

5 **448.955 Examination.** (1) The affiliated credentialing board shall conduct 6 or arrange for examinations for massage therapist or bodyworker certification at 7 least semiannually and at times and places determined by the affiliated 8 credentialing board.

9 (2) Examinations shall consist of written or oral tests, or both, requiring 10 applicants to demonstrate minimum competency in subjects substantially related to 11 the practice of massage therapy or bodywork.

12 **448.956** Issuance of certificate; expiration and renewal. (1) The 13 department shall issue a certificate of certification to each person who is certified 14 under this subchapter. The person shall conspicuously display the certificate in the 15 place of business where he or she practices massage therapy or bodywork so that the 16 certificate can be easily seen and read.

(2) The renewal dates for certificates granted under this subchapter, other
than temporary certificates granted under s. 448.957, are specified under s. 440.08
(2) (a). Renewal applications shall be submitted to the department on a form
provided by the department and shall include the renewal fee specified in s. 440.08
(2) (a), proof of completion of continuing education under s. 448.959 and the evidence
specified in s. 448.954 (1) (g).

448.957 Temporary certificate. Upon application and payment of the fee
 specified in s. 440.05 (6), the affiliated credentialing board may grant a temporary
 certificate as a massage therapist or bodyworker to a person who satisfies the

requirements under s. 448.954 (1) (a) to (e) and (g), has submitted an application to
take the next available examination under s. 448.955 and has not previously failed
the examination. A temporary certificate granted under this section shall expire on
the date on which the person receives the results of the examination and may not be
renewed.

6 **448.958 Reciprocal certificate.** Upon application and payment of the fee 7 specified in s. 440.05 (2), the affiliated credentialing board shall grant a certificate 8 as a massage therapist or bodyworker to a person who holds a similar certificate in 9 another state or territory of the United States if the affiliated credentialing board 10 determines that the requirements for receiving the certificate in the other state or 11 territory are substantially equivalent to the requirements under s. 448.954 and the 12 person submits the evidence specified in s. 448.954 (1) (g).

13448.959 Continuing education. The affiliated credentialing board shall 14 promulgate rules establishing requirements and procedures for a massage therapist 15or bodyworker to complete continuing education programs or courses of study in 16 order to qualify for renewal of his or her certificate. Rules promulgated under this 17section shall require a massage therapist or bodyworker to complete at least 24 hours 18 of continuing education programs or courses of study in order to qualify for renewal. 19 The affiliated credentialing board may waive all or part of any requirement 20established in rules promulgated under this section if it determines that prolonged 21illness, disability or other exceptional circumstances have prevented a massage 22therapist or bodyworker from completing the requirement.

448.96 Practice requirements. (1) A massage therapist or bodyworker may
not practice massage therapy or bodywork on a client unless the massage therapist

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or bodyworker first obtains the informed consent of the client and has informed the client that he or she may withdraw the consent at any time.

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3 (2) A massage therapist or bodyworker shall keep confidential any information 4 that a client in confidence gives to the massage therapist or bodyworker and any 5 other information that the massage therapist or bodyworker obtains about a client 6 in the course of practicing massage therapy or bodywork that a reasonable person 7 in the client's position would want kept confidential, unless the information is 8 otherwise required by law to be disclosed or the client specifically authorizes the 9 disclosure of the information.

(3) A massage therapist or bodyworker may not, whether for compensation or
otherwise, practice massage therapy or bodywork for a sexually oriented business,
as defined by the affiliated credentialing board by rule.

13 448.961 Duty to make reports. (1) A massage therapist or bodyworker shall submit a report to the affiliated credentialing board if he or she has reasonable cause to believe that another massage therapist or bodyworker has committed a crime relating to prostitution under ss. 944.30 to 944.34 or has had sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a client. If the report relates to sexual contact or sexual intercourse with a client, the report may not identify the client unless the client has provided written consent for disclosure of this information.

(2) The affiliated credentialing board may use a report made under sub. (1) as
the basis for an investigation under s. 448.964 (1). If after an investigation the
affiliated credentialing board has reasonable cause to believe that a massage
therapist or bodyworker has committed a crime, the affiliated credentialing board
shall report the belief to the district attorney for the county in which the crime, in
the opinion of the affiliated credentialing board, occurred.

(3) If after an investigation the affiliated credentialing board determines that 1 2 a report submitted under sub. (1) is without merit, the affiliated credentialing board 3 shall remove the report from the record of the massage therapist or bodyworker who 4 is the subject of the report.

5 (4) All reports and records made from reports under sub. (1) and maintained 6 by the department, the affiliated credentialing board, district attorneys and other 7 persons, officials and institutions shall be confidential and are exempt from disclosure under s. 19.35 (1). Information regarding the identity of a client with 8 9 whom a massage therapist or bodyworker is suspected of having sexual contact or 10 sexual intercourse shall not be disclosed by persons who have received or have access 11 to a report or record unless disclosure is consented to in writing by the client. The 12report of information under sub. (1) and the disclosure of a report or record under this 13 subsection does not violate any person's responsibility for maintaining the 14confidentiality of patient health care records, as defined in s. 146.81 (4) and as 15required under s. 146.82. Reports and records may be disclosed only to the 16 department, the affiliated credentialing board and the appropriate staff of a district 17attorney or a law enforcement agency within this state for purposes of investigation 18 or prosecution.

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(5) (a) In this subsection, "violation" means a violation of any state or local law 20that is punishable by a forfeiture.

21(b) A massage therapist or bodyworker shall submit a written report to the 22affiliated credentialing board if he or she is convicted of a felony or misdemeanor, or 23is found to have committed a violation, in this state or elsewhere, and the  $\mathbf{24}$ circumstances of the felony, misdemeanor or violation substantially relate to the practice of massage therapy or bodywork. The report shall identify the date, place 25

and nature of the conviction or finding and shall be submitted within 30 days after
the entry of the judgment of conviction or the judgment finding that he or she
committed the violation. If the report is submitted by mail, the report is considered
to be submitted on the date that it is mailed.

5 **448.962** Advertising. A massage therapist or bodyworker may not advertise 6 that he or she practices massage therapy or bodywork unless the advertisement 7 includes his or her certificate number and a statement that the massage therapist 8 or bodyworker is a "certified massage therapist and bodyworker" or "certified 9 massage therapist" or "certified bodyworker".

10 448.963 Local regulation. (1) A city, village, town or county may not enact 11 an ordinance that regulates the practice of massage therapy or bodywork by a person 12 who is certified by the affiliated credentialing board under this subchapter. No 13 provision of any ordinance enacted by a city, village, town or county that is in effect 14 before the effective date of this subsection .... [revisor inserts date], and that relates 15 to the practice of massage therapy or bodywork, may be enforced against a person 16 who is certified by the affiliated credentialing board under this subchapter.

17(2) Notwithstanding sub. (1) or s. 59.69 (4), 60.61 (2), 60.62 (1), 61.35, 62.23 (7), 18 a city, village, town or county may enact a zoning ordinance that restricts the location 19 of an office in which massage therapy or bodywork is practiced by a person certified 20by the affiliated credentialing board under this subchapter only if the same 21restrictions also apply to the location of a physician's office. No provision of any 22zoning ordinance enacted by a city, village, town or county that is in effect before the 23effective date of this subsection .... [revisor inserts date], and that restricts the location of an office in which massage therapy or bodywork is practiced by a person 24

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unless the same restrictions also apply to the location of a physician's office. 448.964 Disciplinary proceedings and actions. (1) Subject to the rules

certified by the affiliated credentialing board under this subchapter, may be enforced

9 limit, suspend or revoke a certificate under this subchapter if it finds that the

(a) Made a material misstatement in an application for a certificate or for
renewal of a certificate.

(b) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.335, been convicted of an offense the
circumstances of which substantially relate to the practice of massage therapy or
bodywork.

(c) Advertised in a manner that is false, deceptive or misleading.

(d) Advertised, practiced or attempted to practice under another's name.

(e) Subject to ss. 111.321, 111.322 and 111.34, practiced massage therapy or
bodywork while his or her ability to practice was impaired by alcohol or other drugs.

20 (f) Intentionally made a false statement in a report submitted under s. 448.961
21 (1).

(g) Engaged in unprofessional or unethical conduct in violation of the code of
ethics established in rules promulgated under s. 448.953 (2) (a).

(h) Engaged in conduct while practicing massage therapy or bodywork whichjeopardizes the health, safety or welfare of a client or which evidences a lack of

knowledge of, inability to apply or the negligent application of, principles or skills of
 massage therapy or bodywork.

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(i) Committed a crime related to prostitution under ss. 944.30 to 944.34.

4 (j) Violated this subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter.

5 (3) The affiliated credentialing board may restore a certificate that has been
6 suspended or revoked on such terms and conditions as the affiliated credentialing
7 board may consider appropriate.

- 8 448.965 Penalties. (1) Except as provided in sub. (2), any person who violates
  9 this subchapter or any rule promulgated under this subchapter shall forfeit not more
  10 than \$1,000 for each violation.
- (2) A person who violates s. 448.951 shall forfeit not more than \$500 for each
  separate offense. Each day of continued violation of s. 448.951 constitutes a separate
  offense.

24	(b) Notwithstanding section $15.406(3)(a)$ of the statutes, as created by this act,

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and bodyworkers affiliated credentialing board, the members need not be certified
under subchapter V of chapter 448 of the statutes, as created by this act, until the

- Has completed at least 100 classroom hours of instruction in the practice of
   massage therapy or bodywork, or has practiced massage therapy or bodywork for
   compensation for at least 2 years during the 5-year period immediately preceding
   the date of the application.

19 not less than \$1,000,000 per occurrence and \$1,000,000 for all occurrences in one
