ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO 1999 ASSEMBLY BILL 446

September 21, 1999 - Offered by Representatives RILEY, BLACK, COGGS and MORRIS-TATUM.

AN ACT *to create* 111.335 (1) (d) of the statutes; **relating to:** permitting an educational agency to refuse to employ or to terminate from employment an individual who has been convicted of a serious felony.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

Section 1. 111.335 (1) (d) of the statutes is created to read:

111.335 (1) (d) 1. In this paragraph, "serious felony" means a violation of s. 940.01, 940.225 (1) or (2), 948.02, 948.025, 948.03 (2), (3) (a) or (c) or (4) (a), 948.04, 948.05, 948.06, 948.07, 948.08, 948.30, 948.35 (1) (b), 948.36 or 948.40 (4) (a); a violation of s. 948.21, if death is a consequence; a solicitation, conspiracy or attempt under s. 939.30, 939.31 or 939.32 to commit a violation specified in this subdivision; or a violation of federal law or the law of any other state or country that would be a violation specified in this subdivision if committed in this state.

2. Notwithstanding s. 111.322, it is not employment discrimination because of conviction record for an educational agency, as defined in s. 115.31 (1) (b), to refuse to employ or to terminate from employment an individual who has been convicted of a serious felony, who has not been pardoned for that serious felony and whose conviction has not been reversed, set aside or vacated, except that it is employment discrimination because of conviction record for an educational agency to terminate from employment an individual who is employed by the educational agency on the effective date of this subdivision [revisor inserts date], based on a conviction for a serious felony obtained before the effective date of this subdivision [revisor inserts date], unless the circumstances of that serious felony substantially relate to the circumstances of the individual's particular job.
