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## SENATE AMENDMENT 3, TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 69

February 23, 2006 – Offered by Senators KAPANKE and CARPENTER.

1	At the locations indicated, amend the bill, as shown by assembly substitute
2	amendment 1, as follows:
3	${f 1.}$ Page 1, line 3: after "aliens" insert "and making an appropriation".
4	<b>2.</b> Page 2, line 2: delete "To" and substitute "Except as provided in s. 343.1055,
5	to".
6	<b>3.</b> Page 2, line 3: after that line insert:
7	"SECTION 1m. 343.07 (1) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:
8	343.07 (1) REGULAR PERMIT; ISSUANCE, RESTRICTIONS. (intro.) Upon application
9	therefor by a person at least 15 years and 6 months of age who, except for age or lack
10	of training in the operation of a motor vehicle, is qualified to obtain an operator's
11	license and has passed such knowledge test as the department may require, the
12	department may issue a regular instruction permit. <u>If the application is made by a</u>
13	person who qualifies for a limited purpose driver's license under s. 343.1055, and who

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is at least 17 years and 6 months of age, the department may issue a limited purpose
 instruction permit. If the application is made by a male who is at least 18 years of
 age but less than 26 years of age, the application shall include the information
 required under s. 343.14 (2) (em). The permit entitles the permittee to operate a
 motor vehicle, except a commercial motor vehicle, school bus, or Type 1 motorcycle,
 a motor bicycle, or a moped, upon the highways, subject to the following restrictions:
 SECTION 1r. 343.1055 of the statutes is created to read:

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8 **343.1055** Limited purpose driver's license. To the extent permitted by 9 federal law or regulation, the department may issue a limited purpose driver's 10 license to a person who does not provide documentary proof of legal status as 11 provided under s. 343.14 (2) (er) but who is at least 18 years of age and who provides 12an individual taxpayer identification number issued by the Internal Revenue 13Service to the person and who is otherwise qualified for a driver's license. A driver's 14license issued under this section is valid for the purpose of authorizing the holder to 15operate a motor vehicle upon a highway in this state. Except as provided in s. 343.055, a limited purpose driver's license shall not be valid authorization for the 16 17operation of commercial motor vehicles. A limited purpose driver's license shall be a different color or design from a regular license and shall indicate on its face that 18 19 the license may not be accepted by any federal agency for federal identification or 20other official purpose.".

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4. Page 2, line 17: after "United States" insert ", and provided proof of legal status as provided under s. 343.14 (2) (er) at the time that the license was issued".
5. Page 3, line 10: after "apply." insert "An original limited purpose driver's license issued under s. 343.1055 shall expire one year from the date of issuance. A

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subsequent limited purpose driver's license issued under s. 343.1055 shall expire one
 year after the date of renewal.".

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3	<b>6.</b> Page 3, line 10: after that line insert:
4	<b>"SECTION 5m.</b> 343.21 (1g) of the statutes is created to read:
5	343.21 (1g) In addition to the fee specified in sub. (1), an applicant for a license
6	issued under s. 343.1055 shall pay to the department a \$2 surcharge.".
7	<b>7.</b> Page 3, line 12: delete "The application" and substitute "The <u>Except as</u>
8	provided in sub. (4g), the application".
9	8. Page 3, line 19: after that line insert:
10	<b>"SECTION 6m.</b> 343.50 (4g) of the statutes is created to read:
11	343.50 (4g) LIMITED PURPOSE IDENTIFICATION CARD. To the extent permitted by
12	federal law or regulation, the department may issue a limited purpose identification
13	card to a person who does not provide documentary proof of legal status as provided
14	under s. 343.14 (2) (er) but who is at least 18 years of age and who provides an
15	individual taxpayer identification number issued by the Internal Revenue Service
16	to the person and who is otherwise qualified for an identification card. A limited
17	purpose identification card shall be a different color or design from a regular
18	identification card and shall indicate on its face that the card may not be accepted
19	by any federal agency for federal identification or other official purpose.".
20	9. Page 4, line 6: after " <u>issuance</u> " insert " <u>An original limited purpose</u>

20 Fage 4, fine 6: after <u>issuance</u> finsert <u>. All original finited purpose</u>
 21 <u>identification card issued under sub. (4g) shall expire one year from the date of</u>
 22 <u>issuance. A subsequent limited purpose identification card issued under sub. (4g)</u>
 23 <u>shall expire one year after the date of renewal</u>".

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1	<b>10.</b> Page 4, line 14: after "\$9" insert " <u>, except that an applicant for an original</u>
2	card, reinstatement, renewal, or duplicate of a card, issued under sub. (4g) shall pay
3	to the department a \$2 surcharge".
4	<b>11.</b> Page 4, line 23: after that line, before the material inserted by assembly
5	amendment 2 to assembly substitute amendment 1, insert:
6	"SECTION 9L. Appropriation changes.
7	(1) In the schedule under section 20.005 (3) of the statutes for the appropriation
8	to the department of transportation under section $20.395(5)(cq)$ of the statutes, as
9	affected by the acts of 2005, the dollar amount is increased by \$354,800 for fiscal year
10	2006-07 to increase funding for implementation costs associated with limited
11	purpose driver's licenses.".
