SENATE AMENDMENT 2, TO SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 2, TO 2011 SENATE BILL 93

June 14, 2011 - Offered by Senator CARPENTER.

Page 2, line 9: after "weapons;" insert "providing information to a firearms dealer when purchasing a handgun; authorizing the Department of Justice to prosecute violations of certain laws regulating firearms; receiving a stolen firearm;".
 Page 11, line 3: after that line insert:
 "Section 35d. 175.35 (3) of the statutes is renumbered 175.35 (3) (a) and amended to read:
 175.35 (3) (a) Any person who intentionally violates sub. (2), (2e), (2f), or (2j) shall be fined not less than \$500 nor more than \$10,000 and may be imprisoned for not more than 9 months.

Section 35n. 175.35 (3) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

presently prohibited from possessing a firearm under state or federal law is guilty

Section 35s. 175.35 (4) of the statutes is created to read:

of a Class H felony and shall be fined not less than \$500.

175.35 **(4)** The department of justice or the district attorney may institute, manage, control, and direct, in the proper county, a prosecution for violation of sub. (2e) that is punishable under sub. (3) (b) 2. When prosecuting such violations, the department of justice shall have and exercise all powers conferred upon district attorneys.".

"Section 83d. 943.34 (1) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

943.34 (1) (intro.) Except as provided under s. 948.62, whoever knowingly or intentionally receives or conceals stolen property is guilty of:

SECTION 83s. 943.34 (1) (bm) of the statutes is amended to read:

943.34 (1) (bm) A Class H felony, if the property is a firearm or if the value of the property exceeds \$5,000 but does not exceed \$10,000.".

4. Page 58, line 9: after that line insert:

"Section 96m. 948.62 (1) (bm) of the statutes is amended to read:
