**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 12,
TO ASSEMBLY BILL 191**

May 5, 2015 - Offered by Representatives JORGENSEN, GOYKE, KOLSTE, SPREITZER
and SUBECK.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 6, line 11: after “(5)” insert “(a)”.

3 **2.** Page 6, line 13: after that line insert:

4 “(b) No later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the effective
5 date of this paragraph [LRB inserts date], and then every 6 months thereafter, the
6 department shall submit to the chief clerk of each house of the legislature for
7 distribution to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) a report that includes at least all
8 of the following information:

9 1. How many individuals have been tested under this section for the use of a
10 controlled substance.

11 2. How many individuals who have been tested have tested negative for the use
12 of a controlled substance or positive with evidence of a valid prescription and how
13 many individuals who have been tested have tested positive for the use of a controlled

1 substance without presenting evidence of a valid prescription for the use of that
2 controlled substance.

3 3. The total direct and indirect costs that have been incurred to date by the
4 department or any other state agency related to the requirements under this
5 section.”.

6 **3.** Page 9, line 6: after that line insert:

7 “4. No later than the first day of the 7th month beginning after the joint
8 committee on finance approves the plan under subd. 2., and then every 6 months
9 thereafter, the department shall submit to the chief clerk of each house of the
10 legislature for distribution to the legislature under s. 13.172 (2) a report that
11 includes at least all of the following information:

12 a. How many individuals have been tested under this paragraph for the use of
13 a controlled substance.

14 b. How many individuals who have been tested have tested negative for the use
15 of a controlled substance or positive with evidence of a valid prescription and how
16 many individuals who have been tested have tested positive for the use of a controlled
17 substance without presenting evidence of a valid prescription for the use of that
18 controlled substance.

19 c. The total direct and indirect costs that have been incurred to date by the
20 department or any other state agency related to the requirements under this
21 paragraph.”.
