| 18 | 1, 2017, and ending July 31, 2023. |
| 19 | (2) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 4 of the circuit court for Wood |
| 20 | County shall be at the spring election of 2017 for terms commencing August 1, 2017, |
| 21 | and ending July 31, 2023. |
| 22 | (3) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 6 of the circuit court for |
| 23 | Marathon County shall be at the spring election of 2017 for terms commencing |
| 24 | August 1, 2017, and ending July 31, 2023. |

- (4) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 3 of the circuit court for Dunn County shall be at the spring election of 2017 for terms commencing August 1, 2017, and ending July 31, 2023.
- (5) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 3 of the circuit court for Polk County shall be at the spring election of 2017 for terms commencing August 1, 2017, and ending July 31, 2023.
- (6) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 2 of the circuit court for Jackson County shall be at the spring election of 2017 for terms commencing August 1, 2017, and ending July 31, 2023.
- (7) The initial election for circuit judge for branch 2 of the circuit court for Vilas County shall be at the spring election of 2018 for terms commencing August 1, 2018, and ending July 31, 2024.
- (8) The authorized FTE positions for the circuit courts are increased by 6.0 GPR circuit judge positions on August 1, 2017, to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.625 (1) (a) of the statutes, to provide 6 circuit court judges for the circuit court branches created by this act in Calumet, Jackson, Wood, Marathon, Dunn, and Polk counties.
- (9) The authorized FTE positions for the circuit courts are increased by 6.0 GPR court reporter positions on August 1, 2017, to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.625 (1) (a) of the statutes, to provide 6 court reporters for the circuit court branches created by this act in Calumet, Jackson, Wood, Marathon, Dunn, and Polk counties.
- (10) The authorized FTE positions for the circuit courts are increased by 1.0 GPR circuit judge positions on August 1, 2018, to be funded from the appropriation

under section 20.625 (1) (a) of the statutes, to provide 1 circuit court judge for the circuit court branch created by this act in Vilas county.

(11) The authorized FTE positions for the circuit courts are increased by 1.0 GPR court reporter positions on August 1, 2018, to be funded from the appropriation under section 20.625 (1) (a) of the statutes, to provide 1 court reporter for the circuit court branch created by this act in Vilas county.
