5	terminate his or her employment under certain circumstances.
	The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
6	<b>SECTION 1.</b> 118.21 (1) of the statutes is renumbered 118.21 (1) (a) and amended
7	to read:
8	118.21 (1) (a) The school board shall contract in writing with qualified teachers.
9	The <u>school board shall file a</u> contract, with a copy of the teacher's authority to teach
LO	attached, shall be filed with the school district clerk. Such contract, in addition to
11	fixing the teacher's wage, may provide for compensating the teacher for necessary

travel expense. A teaching contract with any person not legally authorized to teach
 the named subject or at the named school shall be void. All teaching contracts shall
 terminate if, and when, the authority to teach terminates.

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**SECTION 2.** 118.21 (1) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

118.21 (1) (b) 1. In this paragraph, "physical assault" means the knowing or
intentional touching of another person, by the use of any body part or object, with the
intent to cause physical harm. "Physical assault" does not include the reasonable
and necessary use of force for the purpose of self-defense or the defense of others
under s. 939.48.

10 2. Beginning on the effective date of this subdivision .... [LRB inserts date], the 11 school board shall include in each contract under this section a provision authorizing 12 the teacher to terminate his or her contract without penalty, including the penalty 13of the payment of liquidated damages, if the teacher is the victim of a physical assault 14or of a violent crime, as defined in s. 939.632 (1) (e), while the teacher is on school 15premises, at or in transit to a school-sponsored activity, or otherwise engaged in official duties on behalf of the school district. The provision required under this 16 17subdivision shall specify that a teacher may terminate his or her contract as provided 18 under this subdivision only if the teacher provides the school board with a law 19 enforcement report documenting the physical assault or violent crime within 2 months of the incident covered in the report. 20

118.40 (1m) (b) 16. Beginning on the effective date of this subdivision .... [LRB
inserts date], a provision authorizing a teacher employed in the charter school to
terminate his or her employment with the person operating the school without
penalty, including the penalty of the payment of liquidated damages, if the teacher

1 is the victim of a physical assault, as defined in s. 118.21 (1) (b) 1., or of a violent crime,  $\mathbf{2}$ as defined in s. 939.632 (1) (e), while the teacher is on school premises, at or in transit 3 to a school-sponsored activity, or otherwise engaged in official duties on behalf of the 4 charter school. The provision required under this subdivision shall specify that a 5 teacher may terminate his or her contract as provided under this subdivision only 6 if the teacher provides the governing board with a law enforcement report 7 documenting the physical assault or violent crime within 2 months of the incident 8 covered in the report.

The 18 provision required under this subd. 2. fm. shall specify that an instructional staff 19 person may terminate his or her contract as provided under this subd. 2. fm. only if 20 the instructional staff person provides the governing board with a law enforcement 21report documenting the physical assault or violent crime within 2 months of the 22incident covered in the report.

The 7 provision required under this subd. 2. fm. shall specify that an instructional staff 8 person may terminate his or her contract as provided under this subd. 2. fm. only if 9 the instructional staff person provides the governing board with a law enforcement 10 report documenting the physical assault or violent crime within 2 months of the incident covered in the report. 11

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**SECTION 6.** 119.16 (16) of the statutes is created to read:

13119.16 (16) TEACHER EMPLOYMENT CONTRACTS. Beginning on the effective date 14of this subsection .... [LRB inserts date], the board shall include in any employment 15contract with a teacher a provision authorizing the teacher to terminate his or her 16 contract without penalty, including the penalty of the payment of liquidated 17damages, if the teacher is a victim of a physical assault, as defined in s. 118.21 (1) (b) 1., or of a violent crime, as defined in s. 939.632 (1) (e), while the teacher is on 18 19 school premises, at or in transit to a school-sponsored activity, or otherwise engaged 20in official duties on behalf of the school district. The provision required under this 21subsection shall specify that a teacher may terminate his or her contract as provided 22under this subsection only if the teacher provides the school board with a law 23enforcement report documenting the physical assault or violent crime within 2  $\mathbf{24}$ months of the incident covered in the report.

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
